

ELECTION OF THE CANDIDATES PLEASE BE SEATED

On behalf of this local Church, Father Bryan Dolejsi, Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese of Seattle, presents the candidates for ordination to the Archbishop.

ELECTION BY THE ARCHBISHOP AND CONSENT OF THE PEOPLE

Archbishop Relying on the help of the Lord God and our Savior Jesus Christ, we choose these, our brothers, for the Order of the Priesthood.

HOMILY

PROMISE OF THE ELECT

PLEASE REMAIN SEATED

The archbishop questions the candidates for ordination on their willingness to undertake the tasks and obligations of the priesthood.

The candidates express their resolve to fulfill the office of priest in accord with the mind of Christ and of the Church.

LITANY OF SUPPLICATION

The archbishop invites the assembly to pray for the candidates, who prostrate themselves before the altar in a Biblical gesture of humility.

PLEASE KNEEL AS THE LITANY BEGINS

PRAYER AFTER THE LITANY REMAIN KNEELING; ARCHBISHOP ONLY STANDS

LAYING ON OF HANDS PLEASE BE SEATED

The gift of the Holy Spirit for service as priest is conferred on the candidates through the laying on of hands in silence by the archbishop and the bishops and priests present. This ancient sign and the prayer of consecration constitute the heart of the ordination rite.

PRAYER OF ORDINATION

INVESTITURE WITH STOLE AND CHASUBLE

The newly ordained are now vested with the priestly stole and chasuble
The stole represents authority entrusted to the priest through the laying on of hands.
The chasuble is the distinctive garment worn only for the celebration of Mass.

ANOINTING OF HANDS

The Archbishop anoints the hands of the newly ordained,
a sign of their consecration to sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God.

The Archbishop presents the new priests with the gifts of bread and wine
to be offered to God in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

KISS OF PEACE

The Archbishop extends a fraternal greeting to the newly ordained.


