





This trauma led to serious cognitive decline preventing her from learning and recalling information needed to pass the English and US civics tests required to become a US citizen. Immigrant Assistance's legal services offered the substantial time, effort and expertise she and her doctor needed to prepare a successful request for a medical exception waiving these test requirements. Our services provided the critical assistance she needed to become a US citizen. With the stability and peace of mind that citizenship provides, she can now focus on her health and building a better life here with her children. 
