JUDY MAYOTTE, MacArthur grant recipient, humanitarian and Cathedral parishioner, will speak on *Fratelli Tutti*'s call to restore humanity's fraternal bond, that we are all sisters and brothers dwelling together on the Earth, our common home. We are called to hear the cry of the poor, our brothers and sisters. We also are called to hear the cry of the Earth, which sustains us and gives us life. Dr. Mayotte's reading of the Pope's encyclical includes a consideration of what walls we build within ourselves, and what structural walls we (as a people) have constructed. Following her presentation, there will be a period for discussion.
