



# World Day Against Trafficking in Persons

## 30 July

*A reflection by Joe Hastings, volunteer with St. James Cathedral Immigrant Assistance*

As a kid with the name Joseph and four older brothers, I was nervous when I first read the story of Joseph in the Book of Genesis (Gen 37). His brothers tired of him being the favored son, and they ganged up on him, threw him down a well, and then sold him to traders headed for Egypt. I didn't want my brothers getting any ideas from this story! Reading it now, I recognize that Joseph was a victim of human trafficking – one of the many stories of trafficking and slavery in the Bible. That Joseph later rises to power in Egypt and plays a key role in the history of God's people doesn't diminish the inhuman crime of selling a person into slavery.

We know that human trafficking and slavery are not just ancient history. Still today, thousands of people – many of them children – become victims of *human trafficking* when they are sold into slavery, indenture, forced labor or prostitution. They are mostly very poor youth from poor countries, who see few options and little hope in their future, and they fall prey to false promises of fake labor contracts, only to find themselves trapped in sweatshops, farm labor, domestic work or prostitution.


The bad news is that is happening at all; and that it happens here and all around the United States.

**The good news is that we are getting better at detecting and preventing it**, not only police and customs authorities, but also flight attendants, hotel managers, doctors and nurses, and even humanitarian relief workers. When I worked with Catholic Relief Services, I saw Child Safe Spaces set up in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake. These temporary schools and day care centers also offered a crucial safe place from traffickers amidst the chaos of disaster recovery. In the U.S., Washington State pioneered efforts to combat human trafficking. Rep. Velma Veloria, the first Filipina-American elected to the WA State legislature worked to help pass the nation's first law criminalizing human trafficking in 2002.
