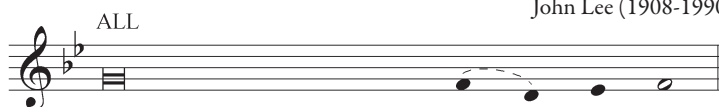

[ALL STAND UPRIGHT]

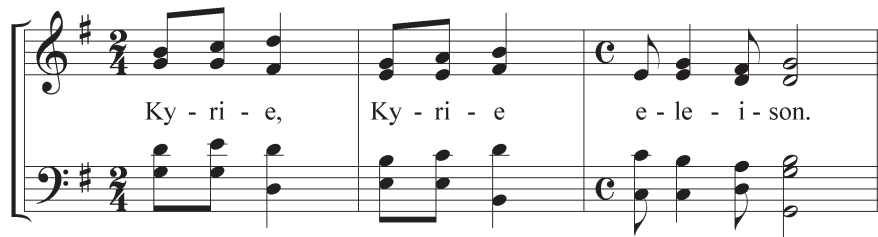
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate,


