



# House of God, Gate of Heaven

5th in a series

July 30, 2023

*Our Cathedral is a tangible invitation to prayer and reflection. In this series, we visit different holy places in the Cathedral, and explore how they call us to prayer. This week, we reflect on the ambo.*

*Master, to whom shall we go?  
You have the words of eternal life (John 6: 68)*

## THE GIFT OF THE WORD

The Scriptures have always been revered in the Church. Jerome, the 4<sup>th</sup>-century saint and doctor who translated the entire Bible into Latin (then the most widely-spoken language in the known world), said that "ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ." But over the centuries, the scriptures were, to some extent, neglected in the Catholic Church. While Protestant scholars advanced by leaps and bounds in the understanding of the scriptures and their historical context, Catholics were left behind. That began to change at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, with Pope Leo XIII, and continued with the Second Vatican Council. In the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, the Council Fathers called for a total overhaul of the readings proclaimed at Mass. "The treasures of the Bible are to be opened up more lavishly so that a richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word" (51). The resulting Lectionary, with its three-year cycle of Sunday readings, was so rich that it has since been adopted by many Protestant churches.

Why is scripture so important? Because "Christ is present in his word" as he is present in the Eucharist. "The Church has honored the word of God and the Eucharistic mystery with the same reverence.... The Church is nourished spiritually at the twofold table of God's word and of the Eucharist: from the one it grows in wisdom and from the other in holiness." (*Introduction to the Lectionary*)

## THE AMBO AT ST. JAMES CATHEDRAL

The importance of God's word requires a dignified place for the proclamation of the scriptures. The ambo at St. James Cathedral is elevated, so as to be visible from every seat in the building. The ambo platform is formed of the same materials as the altar—white marble and black terrazzo—forming a visual link between the "two tables" at which the Mass is celebrated. The ambo itself is an artistic tour-de-force, carved from a single piece of Honduran mahogany by Long Island sculptor Randall Rosenthal. The front of the ambo depicts a lush landscape: clouds and rain, trees and undergrowth, leaves and vines bursting out of the margins. It's a scene we who live in the Pacific Northwest see almost every day! But what does it have to do with the word of God?

The inscription provides the answer. God says to Isaiah: "just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down, and do not return there till they have watered the



earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; it shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:10-11). God's word is a living word, bringing life wherever it goes. Just as rain falls from the heavens, giving life to the earth, so God's word, proclaimed from this ambo, comes to us with its life-giving, life-changing power.

The ambo is a visual challenge to us. As we hear the scriptures proclaimed Sunday after Sunday, do we let them become a living word? Do we let them take root in our lives, and change us?

## FOR REFLECTION

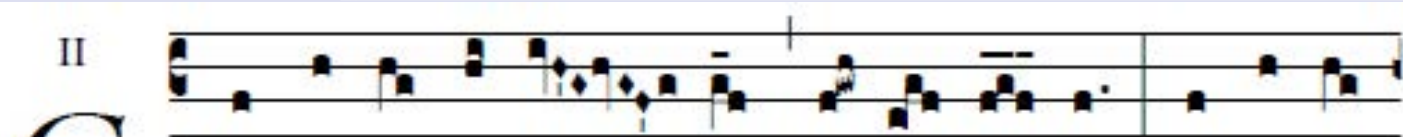

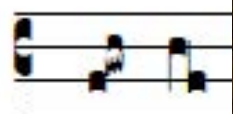

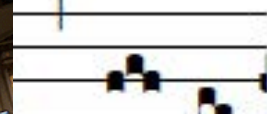

### Contemplative Prayer with Music from Taizé

On the first Friday of each month, all are welcome to a contemplative prayer in St. James Cathedral, with song, silence, and candlelight. The service includes the meditative chants of the ecumenical Taizé community in France, founded by Brother Roger Schutz as a sign of reconciliation after World War II.

This September's service falls on the World Day of Prayer for the Season of Creation. In his message, commenting on this year's theme "Let Justice and Peace Flow", Pope Francis urges us to *"join the mighty river by transforming our hearts, . . . add to the flow of this mighty river by transforming our lifestyles, . . . and for the mighty river to continue flowing, we must transform the public policies that govern our societies and shape the lives of young people today and tomorrow"*.

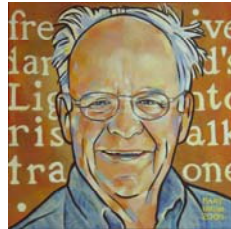
