ST. JAMES IMMIGRANT ASSISTANCE (SJIA) HELPS FAMILIES REUNITE Immigrants must often leave family members behind in their home country and are separated during the long process to become a U.S. citizen. Lawful permanent residents are able to petition for certain family members to join them in the U.S., but they often must wait years, even decades, for a visa to become available. However, when a permanent resident becomes a U.S. citizen, there is no wait time for certain qualifying family members. After completing a rigorous vetting and interview process, these family members can join their loved ones more quickly. As a permanent resident, Juanita (not her real name) petitioned for her husband to join her in the U.S. Their home country was very dangerous. During the stressful wait, Juanita became eligible to apply for U.S. citizenship. SJIA provided her with the needed legal and tutoring support to be successful at her interview. Once she became a U.S. citizen, her husband became immediately eligible for a visa. Soon he was able to join Juanita in the U.S. They were relieved and overjoyed to be safely reunited after their long separation. 





TYPES OF BEQUESTS

UNRESTRICTED BEQUESTS are gifts of cash, personal, or real property which you allow the parish to use for those projects or ministries which are most needed at the time.

RESTRICTED BEQUESTS are gifts made to the Cathedral, which direct the parish in how the funds are to be used. This kind of bequest allows you to support specifically those plans and ministries which are important to you. *Note that restricted gifts on occasion present a challenge because times change and circumstances can reduce or eliminate the need for specific services or programs.* Some areas of need to which restricted bequests can be applied are:

CATHEDRAL OUTREACH MINISTRIES St James is noted for its extensive outreach ministries, including the Cathedral Kitchen, the St. James Immigrant Assistance Program, the Solanus Casey Center, and many more.

CATHEDRAL PRESERVATION A bequest can insure the preservation, upkeep, and enhancement of our magnificent Cathedral and other buildings.

CATHEDRAL MUSIC PROGRAM The maintenance of the Cathedral's two magnificent organs and other instruments, and the remarkable music both at liturgies and concerts relies on the generous donations of many.

THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND Every year the Cathedral provides substantial assistance for children in the parish to attend Catholic grade school and high school.

HUNTHAUSEN FUND Founded in 2001, this program helps the working poor move from shelters to permanent housing, by providing grants for first and last month's rent and deposit. The fund is administered by Catholic Community Services.
