WASHINGTON STATE ADVOCACY UPDATES Support SB 5727/HB 1838, the Lorraine Loomis Act For Salmon Recovery. Across the state, salmon are on the brink of extinction. Some Puget Sound salmon species have declined by 90% compared to historical populations. In the Columbia River basin, returns are as little as 2% of historical levels. The Governor is proposing habitat legislation as a tribute to Lorraine Loomis (Swinomish Tribe, and Chair of the Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission) a longtime champion for the salmon. The Act requires tree buffers tall and wide enough to shade rivers and streams. The Act also requires shifting to a standard of improving ecological conditions rather than habitat loss mitigation. Contact your elected officials (www.leg.wa.gov) and encourage them to support salmon!

PREPARES (PREGNANCY AND PARENTING SUPPORT) is a nurturing response of the Catholic community in Washington State to "walk the journey" with pregnant and parenting women, men, and families with children up to age 5 who find themselves lacking a healthy support network. The program, an initiative of our state's bishops, came into being five years ago. Around the state, PREPARES has been active in helping provide basic needs to parents and their children, organizing parent support groups, providing opportunities for parents and children to get together, and family companions to share relationships with a parent in the community. 

February 8 is the **World Day of Prayer, Reflection, and Action Against Human Trafficking**. There are currently 40 million victims of slavery worldwide (including the United States), one in four of whom are children. Pope Francis said that *“Modern slavery, in terms of human trafficking, forced labor, and prostitution is a crime against humanity. Its victims are from all walks of life but are most frequently among the poorest and most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters.”*

February 8 is also the **Feast Day of St. Josephine Bakhita**, born in Sudan and kidnapped and enslaved as a young child. Subjected to extreme brutality over the course of the next 12 years, St. Josephine Bakhita came under the protection of the Cannosian Sisters in Venice, converted to Christianity, and became a Cannosian Sister in 1896, where she lived until her death in 1947. She was canonized in 2000 and was adopted as the patron saint of human trafficking survivors.



Mr. Adam Neiman is delighted to be in Seattle performing Chopin Etudes Op. 10 and 25; a collection of twenty-four short, technically brilliant, contrasting compositions which span a vast range of emotions from intense sadness to unbridled joy.

This collection includes the famous Etude Op. 10 No. 3 nicknamed the *Tristesse* or "Sadness," which Chopin himself described as one of the most beautiful he had ever written. In contrast, this collection also includes Etude Op. 25 No. 9 known playfully as the "Butterfly" etude. Experience these etudes with Adam when he will give a short talk on Chopin followed by a performance of select works and an audience Q&A.

Adam's journey toward becoming a concert pianist began at the tender age of five, at his mother's tutelage. By age eight, young Adam gained momentum with a succession of regional and national competition triumphs, recital and concerto appearances across the United States, and by his early teens, successful forays onto the international concert and competition circuit. As a 17-year-old undergraduate piano major at the Juilliard School, Adam won three of America's most prestigious classical music awards: an Avery Fisher Career Grant, Gilmore Young Artist Award, and the Young Concert Artists International Auditions. In the same year, Neiman was nominated for a Grammy Award, all before graduating from the Juilliard School with highest honors. 
