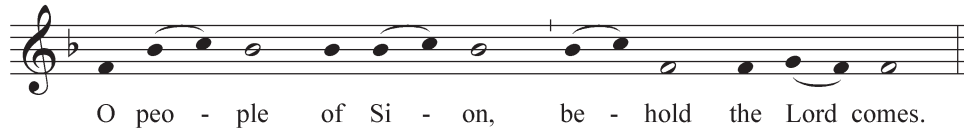

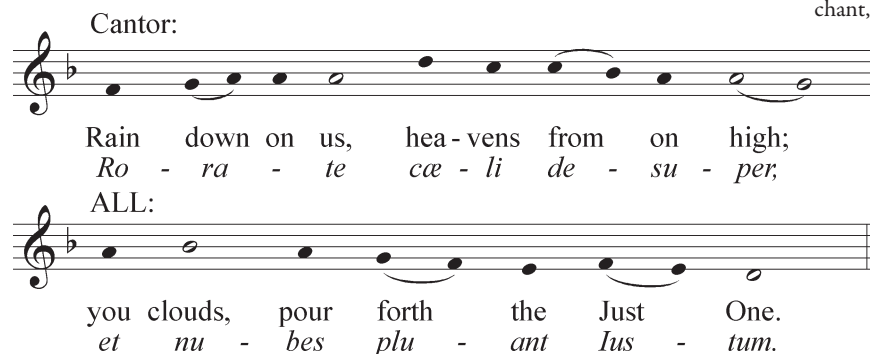

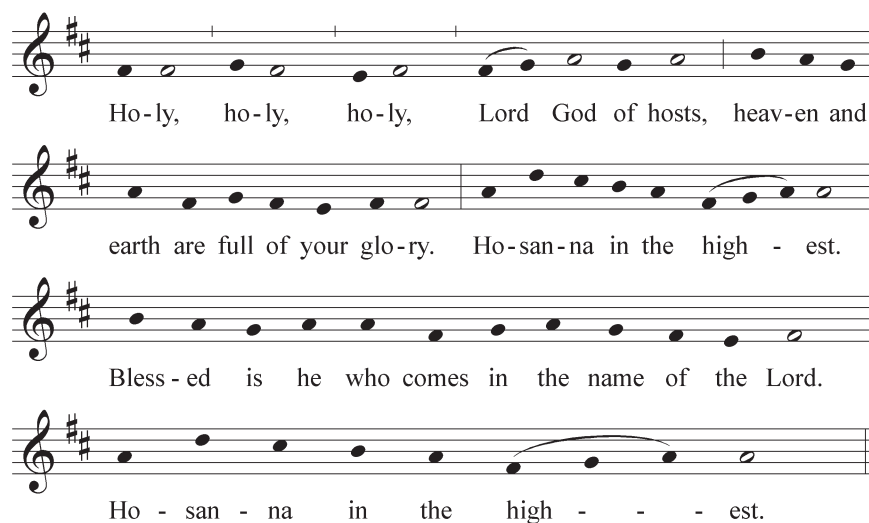

ST VINCENT DE PAUL MAKES A DIFFERENCE A middle aged woman has worked for the past four years as a bus driver for special ed students. This rewarding work with parents and students has brought her out of homelessness and enabled her to get affordable housing. Early in the pandemic, the schools closed and driving students ceased for the next one and a half years. She was paid for the first four months off work. Later she received unemployment income. In early 2021, the woman needed to renew her application for unemployment. A 12 week delay in the unemployment renewal process, resulted in the woman falling behind in rent. She called the SVdP Helpline (206-767-6449), and we helped pay a portion of rent which gave her relief until other resources became available to her. Parish Communal Celebration of the SACRAMENT *of* RECONCILIATION

Monday, December 13, 2021
7:00 pm

During this beautiful service of readings, reflection, and song, we will open ourselves to experience the gift of God's gracious and loving forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance.

Pope Francis says: "The Sacrament of Reconciliation... enables us to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with our own hands. For every penitent, it is a source of true interior peace." *It has long been a tradition in the Church to confess one's sins before celebrating the great feast of Christmas. This will be the ideal time to do so.*
