



Each sonata is a reflection on the Mysteries of the Rosary: the Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries, and the Glorious Mysteries. Celebrated Seattle violinist **Tekla Cunningham** brings part III, the Glorious Mysteries to St. James Cathedral, playing The Resurrection, The Ascension, Pentecost, The Assumption of the Virgin, The Beatification of the Virgin, and the final Passacaglia, which was possibly composed to celebrate the Feast of the Guardian Angels. 
