

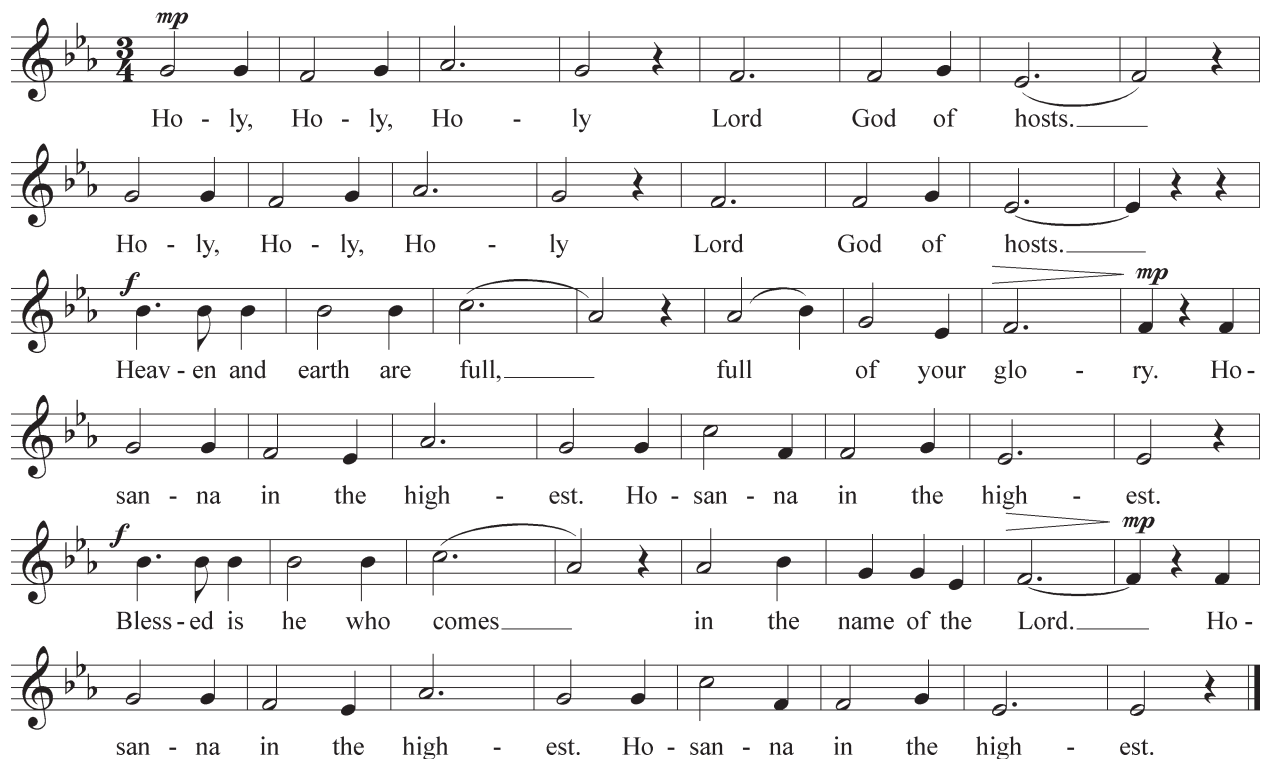

ALL CATHEDRAL READS BOOK CLUB Recently, our parish Sponsor Circle Team welcomed two refugee families from Afghanistan. Under the direction of the St. James Immigrant Assistance Program, we helped these families integrate into American culture, find the resources they and their children need, and provide English language tutoring. To help welcome these families, and better understand their experience, the Immigrant Assistance Program is sponsoring an "All Cathedral Reads" book club about Afghanistan entitled *The Sewing Circles of Herat* by Christina Lamb. The book chronicles the courage and ingenuity of the Afghan people during the first rule of the Taliban in the early 2000s. The book is readily available, and there will also be some copies in the Cathedral bookstore. THE CRS RICE BOWL THANKS YOU St. James Cathedral joined with many other Catholic parishes across the United States to change lives this Lent through CRS Rice Bowl, and we want to say THANK YOU! Today they supply their produce to 16 schools and are able to hire around 15 people during harvest time. 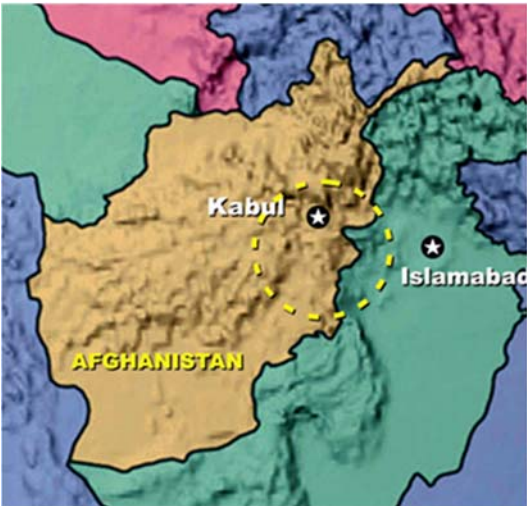

Afghanistan: Then and Now



The St. James Cathedral Sponsor Circle Team has welcomed two recently-arrived Afghan families, living out our call to welcome the stranger. Team members have helped with shopping, moving, enrolling in health care, connecting to a local mosque, airport arrivals, interpretation, finding jobs, and more.

More than 70,000 Afghans were evacuated and brought to the U.S. over the past six months. Some of those who have come to the Seattle area have been welcomed by Sponsor Circles like ours, others by refugee resettlement agencies, and others have come on their own. They join an existing local and vibrant Afghan community.

To learn more about how these families came to be here, and the work of the Sponsor Circle, St. James Cathedral's *Immigrant Assistance* and *Racial Solidarity Team* are co-sponsoring an event that will feature a panel discussion on Afghanistan – its history and culture, the current situation in that war-torn country, and a look at the issues facing Afghan refugees as they resettle in our country. Speakers include:

Professor Farid Saydee, Ph.D. – Kean University, Afghan refugee and founder of Language Mentors International

Mr. Karimi – Afghan immigrant, currently studying for his citizenship with help from an Immigrant Assistance tutor

Brian Beattie – St. James parishioner and currently a member of the St. James Sponsor Circle Team

Sarah Riggio – St. James parishioner and Sponsor Circle Team member, whose family has hosted refugees

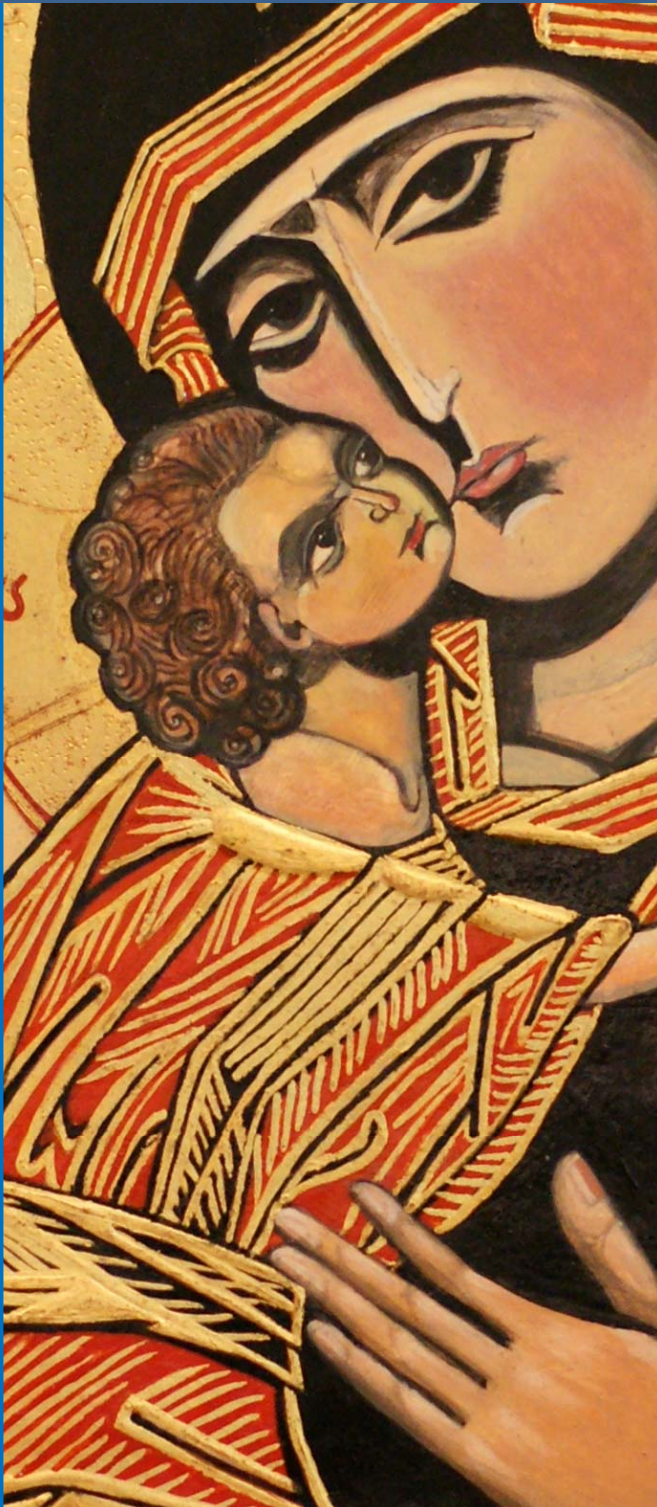
