

## June 20: **World Refugee Day**

Take a moment and remember the **22 million people** who have had to **flee their homes** and countries **in search of safety** for their families and loved ones.

# World Refugee Day

was created over 20 years ago to raise awareness of the plight of refugees around the world. A refugee is someone who has fled their home because of a well-founded fear of being persecuted for their race, religion, nationality, membership in a specific social group, or political opinion. Refugees do not choose to migrate. Many face injury, imprisonment, or even death if they stay in their home country. World-wide, an estimated 65.3 million people are considered refugees - 22 million of whom have been forced to seek refuge in another country, often in countries whose own people struggle to meet basic needs.

As we celebrate Father's Day, let us remember that St. Joseph was a refugee dad, fleeing with Mary and Jesus to Egypt. Pope Francis has declared 2021 "The Year of St. Joseph", saying Joseph is "the special patron of all those forced to leave their native lands because of war, hatred, persecution, and poverty." As Catholics, we are called to welcome refugees with the same love and compassion we would want for our own family, as well as to provide support for refugees who remain in dangerous, unhealthy, and precarious situations.
