#### Dear St. John's school community,

Gathering together for daily prayer is one of the formative pillars of the St. John's experience and an expression of our Episcopal identity. These times of worship draw from both ancient roots and more modern expressions of the Christian spirit, as does all Episcopal worship. Joyful singing, interactive reflection upon Holy Scripture, and participation in communal ritual and prayer have been shown to build character, instill good values, and even help counter anxiety, depression and malaise. Thus while conforming to the language and structure of Episcopal worship, our chapel gatherings serve all community members regardless of their faith background.

This 2020 revised Chapel Book offers a restructured daily chapel service, new options for Holy Eucharist utilizing more modern texts, and an option for Choral Morning Prayer when Holy Eucharist is not possible as the weekly central service of our community. Our revised Chapel Book also includes student art across all three divisions, left anonymous in keeping with ancient church tradition. This new edition conforms to *The 1979 Book of Common Prayer* and supplemental worship materials approved by the Episcopal Church. It highlights several aspects of our calling as children of God through baptism:

- our responsibility to care for and steward the natural world as God's creation;
- our vocation to work and pray for justice and to care for all people of the world, especially those marginalized for any reason;
- and our invitation by God to celebrate and honor the diversity of the human family in all its forms.

We pray that both the children and adults using this book may be moved by the Spirit to deepen their relationship with the Divine, live a joyful life of virtue, and take their part in building the better world our hearts know is possible.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."



After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People

Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN**.






