## Cymbaluk Announces Run for Third Term on Williston City Commission

(March 27, 2018) Tate Cymbaluk announces he will seek re-election to the Williston City Commission. Cymbaluk is in his second term as the Police, Fire and Ambulance Commissioner for Williston. "Our city is safer than it was four years ago, thanks to the addition of the new strategically planned fire stations which have reduced response times for firefighters and ambulances. In conjunction with the leadership of the Williston Police Department, Williston Fire Department and Williston Volunteer Fire Department, I want to continue working as a City Commissioner with a focus on making Williston an even safer place to live," says Cymbaluk. The Public Safety Tax, which the citizens of Williston and Williams County passed in the fall of 2014, underlines the importance of public safety and the dedication of the men and women serving in Williston," says Cymbaluk.

In addition to reducing response times for fire and medical emergencies, the new fire stations resulted in lower fire protection insurance rates for many property owners due to an improved Insurance Service Office (ISO) rating of Class 2 for Williston. ISO ratings are used by insurance companies to determine the risk or likelihood of fire damage in a community. "Public safety improvements such as the addition of more police officers, more efficient equipment and apparatus, addition of more firefighters, two new fire stations allowing for faster response times are not only keeping the people of Williston safer, they're saving people money in the long run," says Cymbaluk. "This is a reflection of the public support of such services and being fiscally responsible in dedicating the importance of public safety. The city needs to stay focused with the necessities of building all emergency services to better serve and protect the community while prioritizing with a vision and the responsible use of funds in allowing Williston to be proactive rather than reactive," says Cymbaluk.

If elected to a third term on the Williston City Commission, Cymbaluk's priorities include:

- Enhance fire and police departments to increase public safety.
- Development and Implement the Upper Missouri Regional Dispatch Center (911) in providing a more efficient & effective Emergency Services Department.
- Improve public works facilities and infrastructure to best serve the community.
- Increase air travel opportunities for Williston and the region through the new XWA Airport.
