Williston Basin International Airport (XWA) is gearing up for its first annual air show on Saturday, September 11th. The event is free and open to the public!

The gates will open at 7 a.m. with a Fly-in Pancake Breakfast hosted by the Williston Lions Club. A free will offering will be accepted. The morning will also feature static exhibits and simulators, a ribbon cutting and open house, aircraft performances and fun activities for people of all ages until noon.

"This air show will provide family- friendly activities that focus on improving the quality of life in the community," said Williston Airport Director Anthony Dudas. "People can experience the airport facility and get to know the XWA staff, not only for flying, but during an entertaining event."

The air show's top performers are all North Dakota-based; coming from Minot and Jamestown.
