The Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (AIDD), Administration on Disabilities (AOD), Administration for Community Living (ACL), at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) invites you to the 2018 State Councils on Developmental Disabilities Technical Assistance Institute scheduled for July 9-10, 2018 at the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center, National Harbor, MD.
