

## **Rector's Report for April 23, 2025 Vestry Meeting**

A recap of events/activities/goings-on since the report for our March vestry meeting:

**Worship** - Much of the past month has been about planning for Holy Week. This past Sunday, we celebrated a joyous Palm Sunday with a very full house at 10am. Our Maundy Thursday was also joyous and full — we ended up adding 4 tables to our initial layout plan as more and more folks RSVP'ed. The evening was parts solemn and joyful and rich, with wonderful music provided by Kate Wallace, Doug Clegg, James McVay, and Tom Joyce (along with “surprise” soloists during the Taize chants) in the first part of the service, and the choir in the second half of the service, in the sanctuary. // We celebrated Kent Carlander life at a memorial service and festive reception, with pies as far as the eye could see; I presided at the burial at Goleta cemetery the next day. // David Gartrell conducted an usher (new & refresher training), and Jeannie Christensen trained a new youth reader (Emma Sizer) and a new LEM (Donna Sugano) // the last Watershed Dinner church of the program year was in early April (in early May, Westmont will be on break, and most of our attendees are Westmont students), and we talked about the environment and inter-connectedness, drawing on Robin Wall Kimmerer's book, The Serviceberry. // Along with Mary Gibson and Theo Patterson, I met with the mother and son who will be baptized at the Easter vigil, in order to do baptism prep.

**Adult Education/Formations** - We finished our 5 part (plus a Saturday) Lenten series on 4/9; many thanks to the planning team (Gary Hall, Georgia Noble, Caryl Casbon, John Draper, and myself). The topic of reading scripture through the lens of poetry was very well received. // Sarah and I met with the YOLO leaders to get an update about the group, and heard about the group's growth, how topics are selected, and how the group operates.

**Pastoral Care / Newcomers:** Over the past month, I met with 8 people for pastoral care or newcomer visits.

**Leadership** - It was a delight to welcome our new Welcome Chair (John Spence) at the April Parish Council meeting and Invite/Welcome/Connect steering committee meeting. // Georgia and I are still working on B&G co-chairs. // Georgia and I met with our new Jr. Warden, Susan Zink, to do some “on-boarding.”

**Financial things** - The Investment Committee met with Mission Wealth for a year-end review meeting on 3/23 // I participated in the Finance Committee meeting on 4/13 to review the first quarter financials.

**Weddings** - In the past month, Trinity has been the site of two weddings over the past month (one presided by at by Sarah, one with an outside officiant)

**Outside building use** - Besides our usual groups who use Trinity's space (CLUE, Ring Shout, AA), we welcomed the Tomato theater company, SBHS choral concert, UCSB concert, and a Bill Wood noon concert.

**Broader church** - My work with the Bishop search committee continues (I'm on the application and interview questions team, and the candidate recruitment team). // I attended the clergy vow renewal service at the cathedral on Tuesday of Holy Week. // My pups and I joined in the Hands Off gathering at DeLaGuerra plaza on April 5 - what a peaceful and passionate gathering!

**Personal:** I'll be missing the April Vestry meeting, as I'll be on vacation for a bit, visiting my daughter in Western Massachusetts, and spending a few days in Sedona doing some hiking. // I met with Ben Ewart last week, at the rectory, to finalize plans for the installation of my new ovens and renovation/relocation of my pantry. Some - most? All? - of the work may be done by the time I return from my post-Easter travels!

### **Parish Council**

We are using up the last of the warming center casseroles. SB Act highlighted Trinity in its latest newsletter, naming us as the volunteers of the month. This continues to be a thriving ministry for Trinity.

### **Sacraments**

I officiated at one wedding and am currently meeting with one couple for pre-marital counseling for a wedding in September. I assisted at one memorial service for Kent Carlander. I baptized Paul Lowi at the Easter Vigil.

### Report from the Junior Warden or People's Warden: Susan Zink

An issue did come up regarding a hand railing that was stolen from the steps leading up to the sanctuary entrance from the Micheltorena Street side and Patsy contacted Wrought Iron Works for a price estimate for a new railing and installation. I haven't heard what the estimate or time frame is. Thank you to Patsy for taking the lead on this.

Elizabeth has been working with new member, contractor Ben Ewert, this last week to finally get a new oven and pantry. She has not had a consistently working oven for years and with all the entertaining she does for the church in the Rectory (new members brunches, children cookie baking, leadership dinners and various other meetings paired with a meal), it is high time for this to happen.

### Notes

- **Our first quarter (first three months of the year) is looking great.** Across all categories, we're doing well - particularly great to see \$121K in net income. We do have some uplift in a couple expense categories such as water, but the staff is looking into if there are any particular building issue(s) that need to be addressed.
- **First draw from our Brackenbury and LBO investment funds.** This month we made our first draws from the Brackenbury (\$35K) and LBO (\$15K) investment funds to cover the Vestry-approved capital projects. This month these funds covered a number of projects, including some repairs and renovations.
- **Investment fund seeing downward pressure.** All of our investment funds saw a loss in value this month due to wider market conditions. Our investment portfolios are conservative in structure, so our loss in value thankfully did not reflect the degree of loss in benchmarks such as S&P 500, etc.
