

Rector's Report for January 22, 2025 Vestry Meeting

A recap of events/activities/goings-on since the report for our December vestry meeting:

Pastoral care / newcomer: Since our last Vestry meeting, I've met with 5 parishioners for pastoral care or newcomer connection.

Worship: December and early January have been a busy worship time, encompassing everything from Debbie Molnar's memorial service to our annual Blue Christmas service, to wrapping up our Advent preaching series on the mystics, to the full-to-overflowing Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services, with the children's pageant at the 4pm Christmas Eve service, and full choir + trumpet and chimes at the 10pm service. Our space was beautifully adorned with flowers and greenery put together by volunteers on Christmas Eve morning. On the Sunday after Christmas, we did our annual Lessons and Carols service, plus Eucharist. // I attended the Watershed Young Adult dinner church on January 12, where we talked about resolutions and implementing habits that feed us spiritually. Many thanks to Isao Sugano who provided dinner for the group.

Fundraisers and a Funraiser: We enjoyed a wonderful event the first Saturday in December: Trinity Backstage, the Christmas Edition, on the labyrinth. Kate Wallace and Doug Clegg, along with several guest musicians, put on a wonderful show in the warm, late-afternoon sunlight. Many volunteers signed up to help with setup/cleanup, welcoming, and refreshments, and the event was a financial success, as well (\$2,000). // We also had an incredibly successful Cookie Walk - the fourth annual - with more people from the community attending than in previous years. Between the cookies and the basket raffle, we netted over \$9200. There were lots of new bakers this year, as well as new volunteers helping as cookie concierges, cookie box packers, and checkout people. // The "funraiser" I refer to is the Annual Ornament Exchange (6th annual), where we do a 'white elephant' style of exchange of ornaments, and share snacks and laughter. About 25 people attended this year's event.

Adult Formation: A subset of the Adult Formation team has been working with Mark Asman to finalize the details of a 2-part series digging deeper into The Dignity Index. We're looking forward to a series about Aging and Cognition Issues (in February), and our Lenten Series about reading scripture in conversation with literature and poetry (the series will kick off on the Saturday after Ash Wednesday, with an all-day workshop led by former Trinity Interim Rector, Gary Hall). // Parishioner Jax Robinson, working in conjunction with the labyrinth group, is organizing an Inauguration of Love event on January 20, Inauguration Day, where the labyrinth will be open and staffed by volunteers to provide a space of calm and quiet in the midst of this contentious political time. This dovetails with MLK Day events in SB.

Miscellany: I was happy to attend a presentation by Fr. Greg Boyle at the UCSB Arts and Lectures series in early December, with some of his points and stories informing my preaching the following Sunday. // There have been 3 weeks this season when we were slated to be the Freedom Warming Center site, but we have not yet been activated. Our next possible date is in

late January. // On Christmas Day morning, our sound system completely died/fizzled, but working with Betty Wenzel and Brian Bargiel, we were able to put together a plan to purchase a new controller unit, get it installed, and then have an audio professional come in to “tune” the overall system and all of our various microphones. Many thanks to Brian who did the installation, and developed the new front end controls that adjust the volume of mics on Sunday mornings.

Personal: I was able to spend some time in Ohio with my extended family over the New Year’s holiday, and am hoping to make my way to Massachusetts sometime this winter to see my child, who wasn’t able to make it to Ohio. It was a lovely visit, but sadly, I brought back a souvenir respiratory virus! (I’m fine now!)

Parish Council

In December we gathered at the rectory for a festive potluck dinner. Worship

Compline is going great, with a record attendance of 90 people last week. Many of these people do not attend Sunday morning services, so it continues to be a great outreach to the wider community, and is also bringing in young adults.

Pastoral Care

I continue to meet with parishioners throughout the month, in-person, on the phone, and in the hospital. I attend our weekly pastoral care meeting as well. The YOLO group is doing great, under the skilled leadership of Michael Arnold. Bouquet Blessings is back and running now that Christmas is behind us.

There are only a couple of updates from our last Committee meeting on November 11, 2024, meeting,

1. The wrought iron fencing to the exterior stairwell on the Micheltorena Street side of the church was installed by Chapala Iron, for the approved amount of \$8550. Chapala Iron has donated the handrail to the Chapel side entrance, in the amount of \$1,200. Painting of the fence is pending, to be completed in-house project by the Church.
2. The replacement of the light fixture lighting the sanctuary stain glass window above the high alter was replaced with private funds as follows:
