Review of numbers 1-10 and colors

This song is an easy review of numbers and colors for the children, perfect for the 3 year old classes. They know all the vocabulary (we just learned ‘Caballo’ (horse) before break and the only new word is marrón which is a synonym for brown.

Suggestions: After reviewing the song a few times, make a pile of objects with different colors. Say the name of the color and the children should pick up the item.

For the 4 year old/T-K, reverse the question and have the children tell you what color is the object and they should tell you if they like/dislike it. “Me gusta/no me gusta”

Farm animals

This was our last lesson for the 3 year old class and will serve as a review for the 4 year old/T-K class. The song adds chicken, duck (perfect for the Mighty Ducks!) and donkey. It also adds another way to say goodbye in Spanish. Interestingly enough, the sounds made by animals vary on the language, so you will hear how Spanish speakers imitate farm animals in this song.
