# **English Composition**

**Level:** AP **Term:** Semester **Credit:** 1 & 3\*

**Prerequisite**: Must meet requirements of Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Allied Science. This course provides a foundation for reading and writing skills that can be applied to personal, academic, and professional life. Students will be expected to employ the basic conventions of APA style with formal and informal audiences; Write with clarity and intention, per formal English language standards; Students will be expected to evaluate and revise their own writing, and that of their peers; Align rhetorical strategies for their audience(s); Integrate knowledge from a variety of sources, synthesize information to form a valid argument; Evaluate research methods and findings; This dual credit course will be offered through Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Allied Science

## **Professional Communication**

**Level:** AP **Term:** Semester **Credit:** 1 & 3\*

**Prerequisite**: Must meet requirements of Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Allied Science. This course is designed to help students write and speak effectively in the academic and work setting. Students engage in writing and speaking assignments to apply the principles conveyed. The importance of effective communication is stressed. Course topics include: communication strategies; Managing anxieties about specific types of communication; effective group communication; verbal and non-verbal communication; Use of visual tools to support valid argumentative strategies; evaluation of research methods and findings. This dual credit course will be offered through Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Allied Science

### **Introduction to Psychology**

**Level:** AP/Dual credit **Term:** Semester **Credit:**  $\frac{1}{2}$  & 3

college credits

This is a college level introductory course to basic psychological processes and study of human behavior including methods, principles, and theories of psychology. Topics will include how the mind influences behavior, the cognitive, psychosocial, biosocial and environmental influences on an individual's growth and development as well as cognitive theories of development pertaining to human intellect. This course will be taught by a faculty member of the Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science. This course may be taught through distance learning, traditional teaching or some combination of those methods. Students enrolled in this course may be eligible for both high school and college credit.
