The term “Beloved Community” was coined by the early twentieth-century American philosopher Josiah Royce (1855-1916). Most of us, however, associate the phrase with The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who often spoke of the “Beloved Community” as his ultimate goal. After the Montgomery Bus Boycotts, in speaking about the larger movement toward which they were building, Dr. King said, “the end is reconciliation; the end is redemption; the end is the creation of the Beloved Community. It is this type of spirit and this type of love that can transform opponents into friends.... It is this love which will bring about miracles in the hearts of men.”
