HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS & COLLEGE STUDENTS

The 2021 Student Academy Awards

Details: Demonstrate excellence in the creation of a motion picture in one of the following categories: Animation, Documentary, Narrative, or Alternative/Experimental

Eligibility: Must be a student in a degree-granting program at a U.S. college

Amount: Cash grants of \$5,000, \$3,000 and \$2,000

Deadline: June 1, 2021

2021 GoFoodservice Scholarship

Details: Submit an application and write a 500-word essay describing how you became interested in seeking a career in Culinary Arts or Hospitality and what you hope to bring to the industry

Eligibility: Open to high school seniors who plan to enroll in college at the start of the next school year, or all students who are currently enrolled in a Culinary Arts or Hospitality Management program

Amount: \$500

Deadline: June 15, 2021

BigSun Scholarship

Details: Submit a short essay on how your participation in sports during your high school years influenced you, how it influenced your career goals, and how it influenced how you relate to your family

Eligibility: Open to all student athletes regardless of the sport they are engaged in or the capacity in which they participate. Must be a high school senior or be attending a post-secondary institution.

Amount: \$500

Deadline: June 19, 2021

Do-Over Scholarship

Details: Submit a written response, 250 words or less, to the question, "If you could get one 'do-over' in life, what would it be and why?"

Eligibility: Open to legal residents of the United States who are 14 years of age or older and either currently enrolled in an accredited college or university or plan to enroll by the fall of 2025

Amount: \$1,500

Deadline: June 30, 2021

Impact on the Community Scholarship

Details: Write a 750-1,000 word essay discussing a time when you made a positive impact on someone or something in your community, and how that experience changed you as a person

Eligibility: Open to anyone enrolled in an accredited college or university within the U.S. High school seniors who are graduating before the deadline and have been accepted to or enrolled in a graduate program are also eligible

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: June 30, 2021

Digital Privacy Scholarship

Details: Complete the application, including a 140-character personal statement that completes the sentence, "I'm taking responsibility for my digital [online] profile by..." Ten finalists will be asked to write an essay about digital privacy to determine the winner

Eligibility: Open to all high school, college, and graduate students; no age limit; applicants must be a U.S. citizen or legal resident

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: June 30, 2021

Details: Submit an unpublished, original poem, 20 lines or less, that has not been entered in any other concurrent contest

Eligibility: Open to all high school students

Amount: \$500

Delete Cyberbullying Scholarship

Details: Submit an essay of 500 words or less answering either of the following questions: "Why is it important to work to delete cyberbullying?" or "How has cyberbullying personally affected you?"

Amount: \$1,000
