



Ball & Skein Feather & Fan Crochet Scarf

INTRODUCTION

This feather & fan ripple scarf is a pattern that can be easily memorized as it is a one row repeat and makes an ideal beginner crochet project. Worked in a dk weight yarn, it can be easily adapted to a different weight to use that special yarn.

SKILLS USED

- chain stitch
- double crochet
- Increasing & decreasing

SKILL LEVEL

Easy



MATERIALS

Yarn

390 yards fingering / light dk weight yarn

Model: Noro Sonata (35% cotton, 25% viscose, 20% silk, 20% polyamide), 1 skein. Color 16

Hooks

US G / 4.25 mm hook, OR size to obtain gauge

Notions

darning needle

GAUGE

Not critical. Note: yarn used usually knit at 20 - 22 sts to 4" in stockinette.

SIZE:

Approx 8" wide by 40" long

ABBREVIATIONS/DEFINITIONS

ch: chain

dc: double crochet

Dc3tog: [yo, pick up a loop in next st, yo, draw through 2 loops] 3 times, yo, draw through 4 loops on hook

sc: single crochet

sl st: slip stitch

st(s): stitch(es)

yo: yarn over hook

PATTERN NOTES

Feather and Fan Ripple is a multiple of 14 plus 3.

DIRECTIONS

Chain 45.

Foundation Row: 2sc in 4th ch from hook, *1dc in each of next 3 ch, [dc3tog in next 3 sts] twice, 1dc in each of next 3 ch**, 3dc in each of next 2 ch, repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, 3dc in the last ch, turn.

Row 1: ch3 (counts as first dc), 2dc in first dc, * 1dc in each of next 3 dc, [dc3tog in next 3 sts] twice, 1dc in each of the next 3 dc**, 3dc in each of next 2 sts, repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, 3dc in top of the turning ch, turn.

Repeat Row 1 for pattern.

Finish when you reach the desired length of scarf. Weave in ends! Enjoy.
