



Ball & Skein Cobblestone Cowl

INTRODUCTION

Named after our signature cobblestone pattern, this versatile cowl is fun and interesting to knit using a worsted or heavy worsted yarn. Choose any color or color combination to complement your outfit!

SKILLS REQUIRED

- Knit & purl, cast on & bind off
- Working in the round with circular needles

MATERIALS

Yarn:

Approximately 180 - 200 yards of any worsted weight yarn.

Model shown uses a discontinued yarn..

Needles

US#10/6.0mm 16" circular

Notions

stitch marker(s)

darning needle

GAUGE

17 stitches per 4 inches in pattern stitch using 6.0mm/US#10 needles.

Please note: Gauge is not critical for the project.

SIZE(S)

One size fits most

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Approx Width: 28"

Approx Height: 7"



ABBREVIATIONS, TECHNIQUES

k: knit

p: purl

st(s): stitch

PATTERN NOTES

Pattern is worked in the round on a multiple of 10 stitches. If you wish to make a cowl you can wrap around the neck, just cast on 200 sts.

When changing colors, knit the first stitch of the new color into the stitch below. To knit into the stitch below, pick up the stitch below with the right hand needle and place it on the left hand needle and knit it together with the first stitch of the round.

If you are changing yarns, it is not important to finish a round or a full pattern repeat, just keep knitting! The same applies when you are working the pattern. If you find you are running short, just finish up with 3 or 4 rows of knit rounds, and then bind off!

DIRECTIONS

Using US#10/6.0mm 16" circular needles, using Color A, cast on 100 stitches. Place marker at the beginning of the round and join, being careful not to twist the stitches. Following the pattern below, change to Color B when you run out of Color A yarn.

Round 1 - 5: Knit.

Round 6 - 10: Knit 5, purl 5.

Round 11 - 15: Purl 5, knit 5.

Rounds: 16 - 25: Repeat Rounds 6 - 15.

Round 26 - 30: Knit.

Finishing

Bind off loosely. Weave in ends and block.

Enjoy your new cowl!
