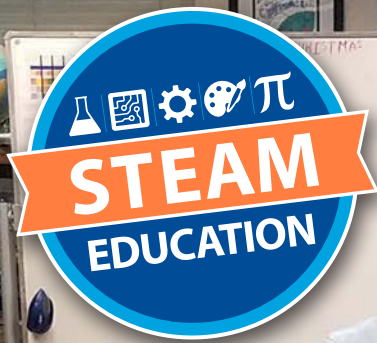

Morning and After Camp Programs

The Morning Program and After Camp Program are charged at a rate of \$6.00/hour and are billed after use. Children must be 3 years of age and potty trained to stay past 3:00 p.m. A family's second and each subsequent child will be charged half price for morning and after camp fees. The Morning & After Camp Program is only available for children who are enrolled in our summer camps.

Meals & Snacks

Send your child with a packed lunch each day and a cloth mat to place their lunch upon. Please do not send items that need to be refrigerated or microwaved. Campers will not have access to either. Should your child be in a camp that has field trips, please be aware of the circumstances of that trip and pack your child's lunch in the appropriate bag or cooler. Children need to bring their own utensils. Snacks are provided in the morning. You are also free to pack your own.

Dress Code

All campers must wear closed toed shoes. No crocs, flip flops, sandals or any other slide on. Our camps are often active outside and at minimum have time on the playground. Proper footwear keeps them safe. Please send your child in comfortable attire that can get dirty. We recommend appropriate length shorts no shorter than mid thigh and a t-shirt. Skirts are allowed, but should have bloomers or leggings underneath as our camps are very active.

Splash Day

Weather permitting each Friday, we will have Splash Day. Please send a bathing suit and towel with your child each Friday and apply sunscreen before you arrive. Water shoes are optional. Our splash day typically consists of an inflatable slide, inflatable pool, and sprinklers. Participation is optional, but should your child not participate they will still be outside with the rest of their camp.

Medications

All medications MUST be given to the front office and the appropriate forms completed. Regardless of age, students are not allowed to keep medication on their person, in their bags, or in their locker. Please be specific when leaving instructions.

Terms

Due to high demand and limited camp space, a non-refundable deposit equal to one week's camp tuition is due upon enrollment to hold a spot for each child. This deposit will be credited towards one of your registered weeks. **All changes and cancellations must be done in writing a minimum of four weeks before a scheduled camp - all fees are 100% non-refundable after that time.**

Changes inside four weeks are possible, but only within the same week of camp, with camp director approval, with space available, and a \$25 fee. Should a camp be canceled for any reason, you will have the option of choosing another camp with no penalty or receiving a full refund for that week. Some camps may have an additional field trip and/or supply fees and parents may be needed to drive.

Beginners Camp | Ages 2 - 4 | Half Day ONLY 9:00 a.m. - Noon

The Beginners summer camp is a Montessori hands-on curriculum combined with weekly educational fun themes, arts and crafts, music, and playground fun! Every Wednesday is dress-up day, corresponding with the weekly theme. Splash Day is each Friday.



June 10 - 14: Music Makers - Craft, create, and syncopate! Dance with the rhythm, beat on the drum, spin, grin, move your body, and revel in the fun. This week's camp will consist of making simple instruments, listening to many genres of music, dancing with props, and having a blast as we explore how music makes us feel and move.

June 17 - 21: Little Chefs *Additional fee for this week. - Come explore implements, ingredients, and techniques as you cook up some excitement! New food tastes better when you make it yourself. Throughout the week there will be peeling, slicing, mixing, and more. We shall eat the tantalizing results for snack each day. Dress as a chef on Wednesday and splash down on Friday!

June 26 - 28: Caped Crusaders - Attend camp as your alter ego as capes are made, masks adorned, and villainy thwarted. Dress in your

hero's best. Practice with your invisible lasso, activate your wonder twin powers, and make this week the most super camp around.

July 1 - 5: Outdoor Theme (No Camp Thursday, July 4th) - This week we will go on nature walks, scout for unusual items, and create temporary outside art. Wear clothes ready for running and enthusiastic art projects. It will be a week of wild happenings and nature collections.

July 8 - 12: Adventurous Art - This week wear your old clothes as we will be getting messy exploring large art in outdoor settings. We will paint with water, sculpt with shaving cream, create with chalk, and explore more fabulous art techniques and materials. It will be one colorful week!

July 15 - 19: No Beginners Camp

Preschool & Kindergarten | Ages 3 - Rising Kindergarten

Ms. Elizabeth Falls *Students must be potty trained and no longer require a nap.

The Preschool/Kindergarten summer camp's focus is to engage the children in theme-related activities utilizing the Montessori hands-on curriculum. They will experience fun educational activities including music and songs, arts and crafts, cooking, and indoor/outdoor games to continue their love of learning through the summer. Splash Day is each Friday.



June 10 - 14: Wild, Wild West - Yeehaw! Grab your cowboy boots and hat as we explore the wild, wild west! Some activities planned include panning for gold; learn to Do-Si-Do; play western games such as Pass the Rattlesnake and Pin the Tail on the Donkey; create some western arts and crafts and bake Cactus Cookies!

June 17 - 21: Hawaiian Hullabaloo - Join us for some oceanside fun! We will take a peek under the waves to learn about ocean life. We will create ocean arts and crafts!

June 24 - 28: Animal Planet - Join us as we learn interesting facts about some unique animals that live on our planet! Activities planned include a visit from students from the Zoo Animal Technology Program at Santa Fe College; playing zoo keeper for the day (stuffed petting zoo); learning the Chicken Dance; playing animal charades and creating animal food art snacks to eat. Arts and

Craft activities like animal sock puppets and making a birdfeeder for our feathered friends are also planned.

July 1 - 5: Science World! (No Camp Thursday, July 4th) - Science activities are an important part of a child's learning experience. Come join us as we encourage children to wonder about the science around them. We will do fun science activities/experiments to inspire science inquiry and to stimulate their learning of science!

July 8 - 12: Artful Antics - Come and experience the joy and fun that art can bring! We will be using various forms of media to create unique art pieces.

July 15 - 19: Ahoy! Pirate Week - Arrgh! Set sail with us as we go on a Pirate Adventure! We will take a voyage into fun-filled art projects (i.e., creating treasure maps and Caribbean-themed painting) going on a Treasure Hunt and baking Monkey Bread!

Elementary Enrichment | Rising 1st - 3rd Grade

June 10 - 14: Little Sprouts *Additional fee for this week - Join us while the weather is still relatively moderate to learn all about plants! We will hoe, plant, sprout, water, and beautify a garden plot at MMS, and also grow potted plants to take home and nurture. Each day will include a craft, working outside (weather permitting), and a lesson about the life cycle of plants. We'll be digging, hoeing, and weeding, so wear clothes that can withstand some dirt!

June 17 - 21: Culinary Kids *Additional fee for this week Let's get cookin'! Rising 1st through 3rd graders will learn how to make and cook a variety of dishes. Some will be cooked in the oven or on the stove, and some will be a no bake recipe. Then comes the fun part - we get to taste our creations! We will also make a craft in this camp, too.

June 24 - 28: Future Scientists - Engage your mind and stretch your horizons through hands-on, lab-based science activities. We will use inquiry-based learning techniques, constructed by true scientists, to discover the world around us. But don't worry, parents, it will be safe for the little ones!

July 1 - 5: Junior Builders *Additional fee for this week. (No Camp Thursday, July 4th) - In Junior Builders camp, we'll be using age appropriate materials to build sculptures, cities, birdhouses, and more! We'll learn all about how to build things - out of cardboard,



paper, and wire, to name a few. Join us as we construct objects on an early elementary level!

July 8 - 12: Around the World - We will "visit" a different country every day in this camp for rising 1st through rising 3rd graders. Each day we will learn about the culture from different countries, and make a craft, have a snack, and play a game from that country. Join us for a trip Around the World in Five Days!

July 15 - 19: Water Week - Let's get wet! This week will be about playing water games and splashing around! Wear your bathing suits, bring a towel, sunscreen, and a change of clothes and let's soak up the sun and water!

Elementary & Middle School Enrichment | Rising 2nd - 8th Grade*

June 10 - 14: Let It Fly This week is all about exploring things that fly through the air. Our campers will design and build different kinds of catapults, kites, rockets and more. We will learn about the science of aerodynamics, the history of flight, and the future of space exploration. Join us for a week of science, flight, and fun!

June 17 - 21: The Great Outdoors *Additional fee for this week. Our goal is to put the SUMMER back in summer camp. This week will get our campers back outside to the roots of nature, literally. Campers will learn about aquifer systems before jumping into a refreshing Florida spring, how to bait a hook before reeling in a big one, and maybe even see a bald eagle or a white-tailed deer while hiking a nature trail. As we explore our local community, campers will gain a better understanding of the Florida aquifer system, the geology of our area, and the importance of local wildlife conservation.

June 24 - 28: Construction Junction *Additional fee for this week. - Strap on your tool belt and get ready to build! Our campers will be guided through hands-on projects that have them crafting, building and decorating their works made of wood, PVC, and more! Our builders will learn about simple and complex machines, use mathematics to measure, and use many tools to construct their projects.

July 1 - 5: Science of Summer (No Camp Thursday, July 4th) *Additional fee for this week. - Staying active in the Florida heat isn't always easy. This week will keep our campers in motion in places where we can stay fit in air conditioning or in the water. We'll work out our upper body and core with bowling, get a great all over cardio burn at Bouncin Big, then put our swimming skills to the test at Hart Springs. Add in learning about the science and physics behind all the activities and our camper will have a blast!



July 8 - 12: Bits and Bots STEM Week *Additional fee for this week. - What do straws, modeling clay, spaghetti noodles and glue sticks have in common? Why STEM projects, of course!! STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics and this week our campers use all of those skills and variety of materials to design and build robots, solar cars, and roller coasters then use their artistic skills to give their constructions a personal touch!

July 15 - 19: H2OMG *Additional fee for this week. - The last week of MMS summer camp needs to be a memorable one, so grab your bathing suit and towel for this week of nothing but aquatic activity. Our campers venture off site to get wet in the Florida sun, highlighted by a trip to Aquatica in Orlando, and have one splashtastic day on site with water based activities all day. Sunscreen up and lets go!

June 10 - 14: Storybook Theatre Workshop For Beginning to Intermediate Performers A fun and educational introduction to the world of theater for the imaginative student, this acting workshop brings favorite fairy tales and characters to life through music, movement and acting. At the end of the week the Summer Camp Junior Players will perform their stories in a showcase for family and friends. All students must wear long jeans and tennis shoes for the performance. **Additional Fee: \$12.00 for Tshirt. Space is limited to 16. *Available to rising 1st through 8th graders.**

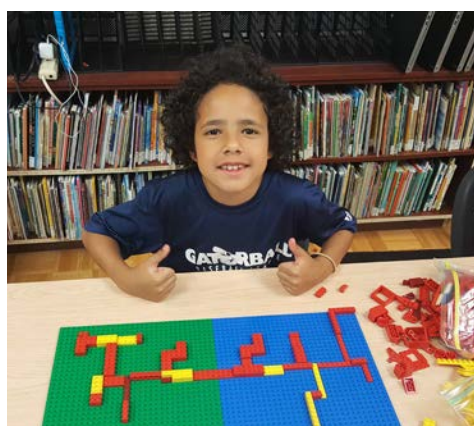
June 17 - 21: Improvaganza This is for the beginning - advanced improviser. Be ready to learn and sharpen skills in thinking quick on your feet, storytelling and acting through pantomime. Each day we will start with warm ups and learn techniques that will help us to think creatively, outside of the box and come up with scenes in the moment. At the end of the week the team will showcase their skills at the Improvaganza Showcase for parents, family and friends. Note: Black long pants, black shoes and a black tshirt are required to participate in the showcase. **Additional Fee: \$12.00 for Tshirt. Space is limited to 16. *Available to rising 3rd through 8th graders.**

June 24 - 28: Coding Jr. A week of innovation, engineering and programming. Using Scratch Jr, Tynker, Kodable and Legos. Students will learn to program their own interactive stories and games. In the process, they learn to solve problems and design projects. Our young programmers will learn coding essentials with hands on plugged and unplugged activities. **Space is limited to 14. *Available to rising 1st through 8th graders.**

July 1 - 5: Lights, Camera, Action! (No Camp Thursday, July 4th) Has your child ever want to star in their own science fiction film? Or star in their own movie or comedy? This camp is for YOU! Enhance storytelling skills by writing a script and learn to film with the school's video cameras. Learn to use WeVideo to edit film and act in the story you create. There will be a Film Festival to Showcase the films on Friday and the students will dress in semi-formal attire for the presentation of their films. **Space is limited to 16. *Available to rising 3rd through 8th graders.**

July 8 - 12: No Drama or Technology Camp

July 15 - 19: Broadway Now 4 Broadway Now is back for its fourth year offered to rising 4th grade – up. This camp is for the **serious performer**. Previous experience required! In this musical theater camp students will hone their auditioning, acting, singing and dancing skills. This year students will not only learn about some of Broadway's most popular shows but also Hollywood's biggest movie musicals! Students will still learn what it takes to be a "triple threat performer." At the end of the week the cast will present a show at local stage. All students must attend camp all week from 9:00am - 3:00pm. **Note:** Must come prepared to audition a 16 bar song for possible solos in various musical numbers. If you are interested in a solo, must come prepared to audition the entire song. The intensive workshop will rehearse at MMS Monday - Wednesday and Thursday and Friday at venue (TBA). 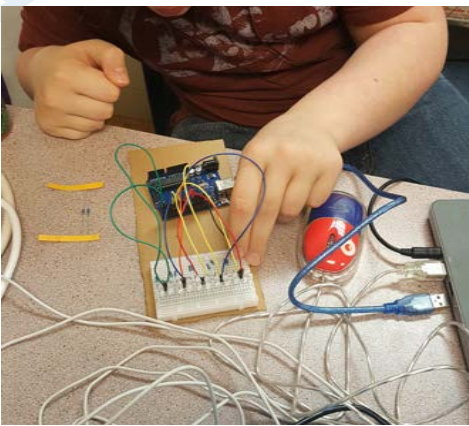
June 24 - 28: Technology - Sharable PowerPoint Storybooks
