

Physical Education--Knowing the State Standards

Did you know that PE has learning standards just like every other subject area? The State of Michigan recognizes SHAPE, America's National Standards as our state standards. These standards are what students should know and be able to do as a result of a highly effective physical education program. They help form a well-rounded classroom that not only gives students physical skills to be active, but also the knowledge of how the body works and why it is important. The following is two of the five standards, and examples of the standard in "kid language", along with examples of what it looks like in PE.

Standard 1: The physically literate individual demonstrates competency in a variety of motor skills and movement patterns.

- "I have the skills to move and play"
- I can. . . run, hop, skip, jump, throw, catch, dribble, strike, kick and pass.

Standard 2: The physically literate individual applies knowledge of concepts, principles, strategies and tactics related to movement and performance.

- "I show that I know how to move and use a plan when I play games."
- 1 can. . . move safely at appropriate speeds, use offensive and defensive strategies, and use space and pacing during games.

Each student is at a different level in Physical Education class. We are working on making progress towards keeping the gymnasium a safe place to move and play. While students have different physical skill levels, we focus on the daily effort and attitude that the students display while in class.
