MAPS Announces Organization's "Builders" to be Recognized at 50th Anniversary Gala in April

The Massachusetts Alliance of Portuguese Speakers (MAPS) is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2020 with a special fundraising gala in April which will highlight the health and social services organization's rich history by honoring a group of more than 50 individuals who were instrumental in its creation, development and expansion. The black-tie, entertainment-filled event will take place at the Boston Marriott Hotel in Cambridge on April 25, 2020, and will also highlight some of MAPS' main achievements ever the past half-century, divided by decade.

For the **1970's**, MAPS will highlight its origins as two separate organizations – the Cambridge Organization of Portuguese Americans (COPA), founded in 1970; and the Somerville Portuguese American League (SPAL), created in 1973. The individuals to be recognized for their contributions during the 1970's include the founders and staff members of the two organizations, public officials, and key volunteers and contributors: Manuel Amaral; Jose Bairois; Duke Carvalho; José Chaves (deceased); Dorothea Clinton (deceased); Josh Coburn; Maria Angelina Costa; Victor do Couto; Tony de Castro; Hermano de Mello; Zelia Pacheco Kelleher; Fernando Lopes (deceased); José Luis (Mr. COPA, deceased); Maria Manuel Moreira; Albert Pacheco; Carmen Pacheco-Medeiros; Robert (Bob) Perry; Rosa-Maria Cardoso Pinto; Mary Roderick (deceased); Manny Rogers; Margaret C. Serpa; Valadão Serpa; Aurélio Torres; Maria Torres; Mayor Alfred Vellucci (deceased); and Caetano S. Vital.

To remember the **1980's**, MAPS will tell the story of community building and the creation of the HIV/ STI Prevention and Screening Program at SPAL, which at the time caused some very heated discussions in the community, and the opening of the organization to the growing Brazilian and Cabo Verdean communities. The organization will honor the impactful contributions of Albano Ponte, António Cardoso, António Couto (deceased), Belmira Cordeiro, Manuel Coutinho (deceased), António Fontes (deceased), Mario Furtado (deceased), Mary Ghioni, Luisa Gonçalves (deceased), João Soares, and Julia Story.

The **1990's** marks the official merger of COPA and SPAL to create MAPS, and the expansion into Lowell. For this decade, the organization will honor Adir Baldelim, Jorge Cardoso, Victor DoCouto, John Dreyer, Mary Ann Lomba, Adélia Furtado Lopes (deceased), Célia Maciel, Glenn Mello, Lucieny Passamani, Luís Pedroso, Stephen Pereira, Elisia and Mark Saab, and Ligia Taylor (deceased).

In the **2000's**, MAPS saw a significant growth of its Domestic Violence/ Sexual Assault and other programs, as well as expansion into Dorchester and Framingham. MAPS will honor the following former staff members, program directors, community leaders and public officials for their contributions to this expansion: Michael Coelho, Carlos da Silva, Norberto Felix, Alvaro Lima, Isaac Machado, Ana Nava, Osvalda Rodrigues, Josefina Silva, Denise Spezziale, Cambridge City Councillor Tim Toomey, and Joe Vasconcelos.

During the **2010's**, MAPS benefitted from a significant increase in community involvement and philanthropy.
