## FAMILY RESILIENCE AND RECOVERY: OPIOIDS AND OTHER ADDICTIONS

The 2019 Chautauqua, funded, in part, by ODMHSAS and SAMHSA, will focus on the relationship between family resilience and recovery from addiction, with a focus on opioids. Scholars will present information on etiology of substance use disorders on the family system, as well as new research on resilience in addiction recovery. Moderated panel discussions will focus on how research can be used to inform society's understanding of addiction with particular attention to solving the opioid epidemic, decreasing the prevalence of addiction, and preventing its occurrence in younger generations.
