

All who seek to receive Christ in the sacrament of this meal are welcome to partake of the bread and wine. Please come to the altar up the center aisle and return to your pew down the side aisles. You are welcome to receive both the bread and the wine, bread only, or a blessing. To receive the bread, stand or kneel at the altar rail and the priest will place the host in your hands. The wine is available either from the common cup, or in individually pre-packaged containers on small tables at either end of the altar rail. To receive the wine from the pre-packaged cup, open the foil seal at the top of the container, drink the wine, and place the empty cup into the basket.

Thanks go especially to the generous sponsors who made it possible for us to offer free or discounted meals to our community. It was a true blessing to sit together, eat, and celebrate all the good things God has done for us.

Pressure on local food pantries is increasing greatly during what is already their highest-demand season. If you are in a position to help, please consider making a cash donation to Harvest on Vine, our local food pantry, or bring canned goods or other non-perishables to the basket at the back of the church. Patricia Noonan will get those donations to Harvest on Vine. If you are worried about your own finances due to the loss of SNAP this month, please talk to Greg and he can help connect you with other resources.

You are invited to begin Advent with a community event intended to set aside a couple of hours to be together for fellowship and conversation. On **Tuesday, December 2, at 6:30pm**, join us at the church for an "Entering Advent" potluck. Bring a dish, an appetizer, drinks, or a dessert to share. We'll have some conversation prompts on Advent themes, and a prayer or two, but it will mostly be a chance to be together.

Church Budget Fast Facts

As you consider your pledge for 2026, the Vestry would like to share an overview of our overall budget.

St. John's has an annual budgeted income of \$226,205:

- 55% from pledge donations
- 13% from other giving
- 15% from building rentals*
- 13% from investment income
- 4% from fundraisers and other sources

We receive no financial support from the Episcopal Church or from the Diocese of Massachusetts.

* We are actively looking for new rentals to increase this. Referrals are helpful, so if you know a music class, kids' activity, or other community group looking for space, please speak with the Rector or a Vestry member.

St. John's has annual budgeted expenses of **\$260,000**:

- 39% in salary and benefits for the Rector, who is employed at 60% of full time
- 29% in salary and benefits for our part-time lay staff
- 14% for utilities and building expenses
- 8% to our Diocesan Assessment, which supports the ministry of the wider church
- 10% all other costs (office expenses, music program, outreach, fellowship)

This means we have a structural deficit of \$33,000, even with a part-time priest.

Gathering pledges during the fall stewardship campaign every year allows us to put together an accurate budget for the coming year. Thank you for your ongoing support for the ministry of the church.
