

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate for Baptism

The Presider says The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The family stands and presents the candidate as the people remain seated.

We present Theodore James Lantz to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Presider asks the parents and sponsors the following questions:

Presider Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Sponsors **I will, with God's help.**

Presider Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Sponsors **I will, with God's help.**

Presider Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Parents and Sponsors **I renounce them.**

Presider Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Parents, and Sponsors **I renounce them.**

Presider Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Parents and Sponsors **I renounce them.**

Presider Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Parents and Sponsors **I do.**

Presider Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Parents and Sponsors **I do.**

Presider Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Parents and Sponsors **I do**

The congregation stands and the Presider addresses them.

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

All respond **We will.**

Presider Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

Priest Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Priest Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the**

Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Priest Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Priest Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Priest Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Preside Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Priest Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Priest Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Priest Will you cherish the wondrous works of God, and protect the beauty and integrity of all creation?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Prayers for the Candidate

Celebrant Let us now pray for this person who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Leader Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

The Baptism

The Candidate is presented to the Presider, who then baptizes with these words:

Presider I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People **Amen!**

The newly baptized is marked with the sign of the cross with Chrism, with these words:

Priest You are sealed with the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

People **Amen!**

The Presider prays over the newly baptized, and then presents a candle lit from the Paschal Candle. All then join in praying the St. John's Baptismal Prayer.

People **Bless we beseech thee, O heavenly Father, the parents of this child, and give to them and to all in whose charge he may be the spirit of wisdom and love: that his home may be to him an image of thy kingdom, and the care of his parents a likeness of thy love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Presider Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

All who seek to receive Christ in the sacrament of this meal are welcome to partake of the bread and wine. Please come to the altar up the center aisle and return to your pew down the side aisles. You are welcome to receive both the bread and the wine, bread only, or a blessing. To receive the bread, stand or kneel at the altar rail and the priest will place the host in your hands. The wine is available either from the common cup, or in individually pre-packaged containers on small tables at either end of the altar rail. To receive the wine from the pre-packaged cup, open the foil seal at the top of the container, drink the wine, and place the empty cup into the basket.
