The Employment & Training Division helps to build a workforce to meet the changing demands of Wyoming's diverse businesses, citizens and economy. Employment & Training administers a number of important programs, including the Wagner-Peyser Program, Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act, the Veterans Employment and Training Program, the Work Opportunity Tax Credit Program and the Migrant Seasonal Farm Worker Program among others.

The Employment & Training Division provides programs and services throughout our 18 Workforce Centers across the state.

Business Training Grants

To either correct employee's skill deficiency or upgrade current skill level and that training is a direct relationship to their occupation.

Covered Services Include:

- Tuition/Registration (required)
- Class Materials/Fees
- Travel Expenses

New Funding limits:

- \$4,000 / \$5,000 per trainee per SFY; based on preferred industry
- \$200,000 per SFY per business



Pre-Hire Economic Development Grants

Provides funding to obtain trained workers for a new or expanding business, in addition to now providing training funds to replace lost workers.

- **Emergency medical service providers are now eligible**

In FY 2021, the Workforce Development Training Fund approved 2 applications totaling \$390,887. As a result of this funding, 208 individuals received training to support the healthcare industry.

Pre-Obligation Grant

Available to economic development entities in collaboration with new or expanding businesses.

Obligated Funds not to exceed the equivalent of 200 trainees multiplied by the maximum amount allotted per trainee and industry.

- **\$4,000 per trainee per state fiscal year.**
- **\$5,000 per trainee in a preferred industry per state fiscal year.**

Funds accessed through either a Pre-Hire Grant or Business Training grants



Preferred Industries for Pre-Obligation Grants

- Construction
- Finance and Insurance
- Healthcare and Social Assistance
- Manufacturing
- Technology
- Hospitality and Tourism



Internship Grant

The Internship Grant provides funding to Wyoming businesses to provide structured learning experiences to individuals to enhance their work skills, knowledge, and abilities.

Increased wage reimbursement:

- **Up to \$25/hour per industry standard**
- **Up to 1040 hours per SFY.**
- **Up to 6 Internships based on Industry need and ability to support.**






In FY 2021, the Workforce Development Training Fund approved **60 Internship Grants for a total of \$823,108.60.**

This grant option served **101 interns** in **24 different industries.**

Apprenticeship Grants

Available to Wyoming-based Registered Apprenticeship Programs and its related technical Instruction Providers to assist with the cost of the related instruction of the registered apprenticeship program.




Performance measures are now more flexible for each specific apprenticeship program and its specific needs.



Apprenticeship Grants


In FY 2021, the Workforce Development Training Fund approved 6 Apprenticeship Grant applications totaling \$154,838.

As a result of this training, **83 apprentices** received related instruction to support **5 major industries**.
