Scripture Lesson – Matthew 3:1-8

Advent Wreath Liturgy “*Jon and Roberta Nelson*”

A prophet speaks and a messenger cries out, telling us the Lord will come. We are to prepare the way: to repent and make the Lord’s pathways straight. For days marked by the righteousness and faithfulness of God are coming and will be a signal to all peoples. In those days the Lord will bring forth justice and peace, reconciling all creation.
