Call to Worship:

Pastor: God is with us. God is coming into our lives in a new way. The birth of the Christ-child is the renewal of hope; a reminder that Christ will come again. Keep watch for the light, it is drawing near.

The Lighting of the Christ Candle

People: Lord, bless all who look upon this manger. May it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise up our thoughts to him, who is Godwith-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.
