Christmas

December 25 is Christmas. Christmas is both a national holiday and a religious holiday. Christians remember the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas. Many non-Christians celebrate Christmas too.

The Christmas season starts after Thanksgiving, in late November. Christmas is a time for giving presents to friends, family, and poor people. Churches, businesses, and other groups give money, food, and toys to needy families.

Some people make gifts, but most people buy presents in stores. Stores get very crowded around Christmas. There are shoppers everywhere! Stores have beautiful decorations in Christmas colors of red and green.

Many people decorate their homes at Christmas. They buy trees and decorate them with electric lights and ornaments. Some people put electric lights outside their houses. At Christmas, neighborhoods are beautiful with many bright Christmas lights.

Jewish people have a Festival of Lights in December. For eight days, Jewish people light candles and give gifts. This festival, Hanukkah, is a joyful holiday.

Before Christmas or Hanukkah, people send greeting cards to friends and relatives. These cards say "Season's Greetings," "Happy Holidays" or "Merry Christmas." People also bake cookies to share with friends and neighbors.

Christmas Eve is the night before Christmas. Children believe a fat, jolly man brings gifts on Christmas Eve. His name is Santa Claus. During the weeks before Christmas, parents bring their children to see Santa. Many stores have a Santa Claus for children to visit. The little girl in the picture is telling Santa about a teddy. She wants a teddy for Christmas. Santa tells her, "Ho, ho, ho, and a Merry Christmas!"

Late on Christmas Eve, Santa comes down the chimney and puts presents under the tree. He also puts gifts in children's stockings. On Christmas morning, children look under the tree and in their stockings for gifts from Santa Claus.

Many people go to church on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. They sing joyful songs, Christmas carols. On Christmas Day, families open gifts and eat a holiday dinner together.
