What is spring like in your hometown? When do seasonal changes usually begin?

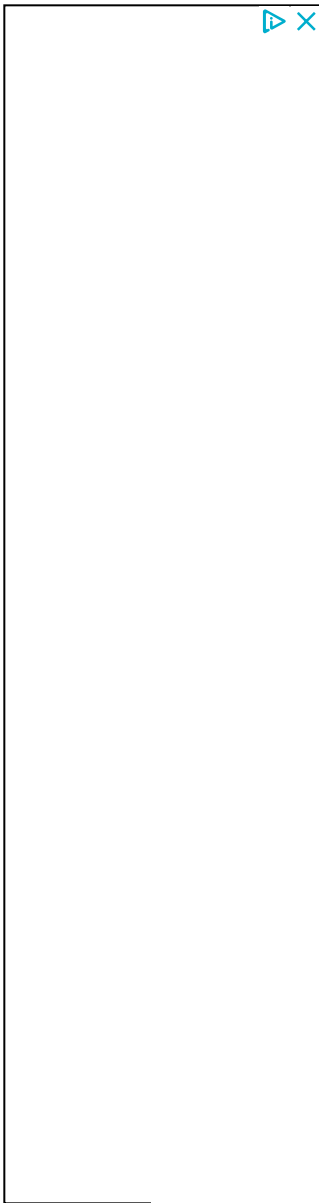
Has spring changed (gotten shorter, longer, warmer, etc.) in your home country in recent years? If so, how? Do global climate changes concern you? Why or why not?

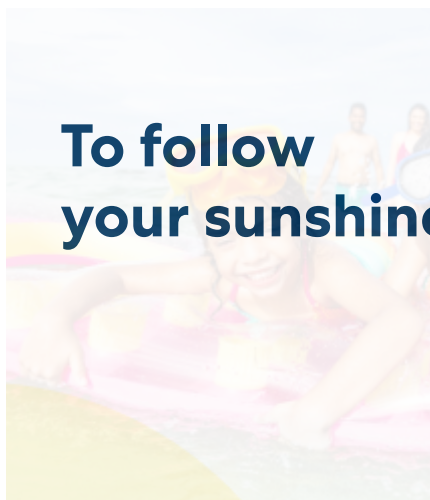
What is your favorite season? Why?
