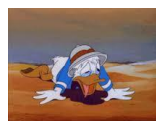

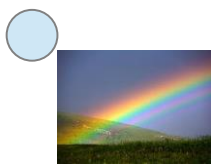

Solutions: Here you can find the definitions of all the words used in the first part of the quiz.
The words in red are the correct answers:

Baroness: a woman who has the same rank as a baron.

Thermometre: an instrument used for measuring the temperature of the air, a person's body, etc.

Barometer: an instrument for measuring air pressure to show when the weather will change.

Heater: a machine used for making air or water warmer.

Hothead: a person who often acts too quickly, without thinking of what might happen.

Heatwave: a period of unusually hot weather.

Snowdon: the highest mountain in Wales.

Blizzard: a snowstorm with very strong winds.

Blitz: a sudden attack.

Light show: a display of changing coloured lights, for example at a pop concert.

Lighter: a small device that produces a flame for lighting cigarettes.

Lightning: a flash, or several flashes, of very bright light in the sky caused by electricity.

Wellington boot: one of a pair of long rubber boots usually reaching almost up to the knee, that you wear to stop your feet from getting wet.

Denver boot: (AmE) a device that is attached to the wheel of a car that has been parked illegally, so that it cannot be driven away. (BrE: clamp, wheel clamp)

Safety boot: a durable boot that has a protective reinforcement in the toe which protects the foot from falling objects or compression, usually combined with a mid sole plate to protect against punctures from below.

Ice cube: a small usually square, piece of ice used for making drinks cold.

Ice bucket: a container filled with ice and used for keeping bottles of wine, etc, cold.

Hail: small balls of ice that fall like rain.

Cymbal: a musical instrument in the form of a round metal plate which is hit with a stick, or two cymbals one hit against each other.

Cyclone: a violent tropical storm in which strong winds move in a circle.

Cyclops: a giant with only one eye in the middle of his face.

Scorching: adjective which means very, very hot.

Scouting: the activities that boy and girl scouts take part in.

Scraping: a small amount of something produced by scratching a surface.

Rainmaker: (AmE, business) a person who makes a business grow and become successful.

Waterfall: a place where a stream or river falls from a high place, for example over a cliff or rock.

Raincoat: a long light coat that keeps you dry in the rain.

Thumb: the short thick finger at the side of the hand, slightly apart from the other four.

Thyme: a plant with small leaves that have a sweet smell and are used in cooking as a herb.

Thunder: the loud noise that you hear after a flash of lightning, during a storm.

Smoko: a rest from work, for example to smoke a cigarette.

Smog: a form of air pollution that is or looks like a mixture of smoke and fog.

Foghorn: an instrument that makes a loud noise to warn ships of danger in fog.

Dimple: a small hollow place in the skin, especially in the cheek or chin.

Dump: a place where waste or rubbish/garbage is taken and left.

Damp: adjective which means slightly wet, often in a way that is unpleasant.

Rain gauge: an instrument for measuring the amount or level of rain.

Rain drop: a single drop of rain.

Rain proof: adjective that means that something can keep rain out.

Draught: a flow of cool air in a room or other confined space.

Drought: a long period of time where there is little or no rain.

Dryer: a machine for drying something (in this case, your hands)

Snow-blind: adjective that means unable to see because of the light reflected from a large area of snow.

Rainbow: a curved band of different colours that appears in the sky when the sun shines through rain.

Shower: a short period of rain or snow.

Sleepy: adjective which means needing sleep or ready to go to sleep.

Slippery: adjective which describes for example an icy surface, because it is difficult to stand or move on it.

Slipper: a loose soft shoe that you wear in the house.

Water vole: an animal like a rat that swims and lives in a hole beside a river or lake.

Flock: a group of sheep, goats or birds of the same type.

Flood: a large amount of water covering an area that is usually dry.

Moist: adjective which means slightly wet.

Mist: a cloud of very small drops of water in the air just above the ground that makes it difficult to see.

Mitten: a type of glove that covers the four fingers together and the thumb separately.
