

HEALTH BENEFITS FOR IMMIGRANT ADULTS (HBIA)

Illinois has a new health insurance program called Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults (HBIA). It is for immigrants ages 55-64 who do not qualify for Medicaid. Accessing health care services through this program will not count against you for the public charge test. Enrollment is open now!

To qualify, you must:

1. Be between 55-64 years old AND
 - a. Be an undocumented immigrant OR
 - b. Have a work permit or a be a permanent legal resident of the United States for less than 5 years OR
 - c. Have another immigration status that makes you ineligible for traditional Medicaid.
2. Have an income that is less than 138% of the federal poverty level (FPL).

What Does HBIA Cover?

HBIA provides comprehensive coverage with no premiums and no copays. After enrollment, HBIA can help cover medical bills from up to 3 months prior.

- Doctor's Office and Hospitals
- Laboratory tests
- Rehabilitation (Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy)
- Mental health and substance use disorder services
- Dental and vision
- Prescription drugs



HBIA does not cover nursing homes or community-based home services.
