DAY ONE: Monday, April 6, 2020 – LOS ANGELES DEPARTURE

10.45am Arrive at Los Angeles International Airport and meet your World Projects Tour Manager who will assist with checking in with KLM.
After checking in your luggage and instruments, move through security onto the departure gate.
1.50pm Depart Los Angeles for Amsterdam on KLM flight KL#602.
Overnight en route.

DAY TWO: Tuesday, April 7, 2020 – Arrive AMSTERDAM (D)

9.10am Arrive in to Amsterdam. Pass through immigration, collect your luggage, and proceed with customs formalities.
You will be met by your local Tour Escorts who will travel with you throughout the tour.
Load the coaches and equipment truck and transfer to the city center.

Open-hearted, welcoming, and prosperous, Amsterdam is a good-time city that merrily opens its arms to all comers. It embraces its tourists, its cyclists, its boat-folk, and its multi-cultural community. It is friendly, unflappable, and approachable; a city confident in its own skin but with one eye fixed on the future, buzzing with creativity and bonhomie.

Afternoon Lunch on your own in Amsterdam.
After lunch, board your private canal boats for a Guided Sightseeing Tour of Amsterdam, which is best seen from the water. The canal boats will take you through the city's ingenious system of canals past its mansions, bridges, and flower market.

Evening There will be time to settle in and freshen up.
Enjoy a Welcome Dinner as a group at a local restaurant featuring Dutch cuisine, and then return to the hotel for an early night after a long day of travel!



DAY THREE: Wednesday, April 8, 2020 – AMSTERDAM (B) – Sectional Clinics

Morning: Breakfast as a group at the hotel.
 After breakfast, load the coaches (bring instruments) and depart for a visit to the Anne Frank House (*subject to ticket availability*).

The Anne Frank House is one of Amsterdam's most popular attractions for the insights it provides into the incarceration of 13-year-old Anne Frank and her Jewish family during the Nazi occupation of Amsterdam in World War II.

Afternoon Lunch on your own in the area.
 After lunch, transfer to a local rehearsal venue and setup.
 Enjoy **sectional clinics** with members of prominent Dutch orchestras (TBC – possibly the Concertgebouw, Dutch Philharmonic Orchestra, Metropole Orchestra, etc.). Clinics will be broken down into Strings, Woodwinds, Brass, and Percussion.

Evening Dinner on own in Amsterdam.
 Following dinner, transfer to the Concertgebouw and take your seats.
7.30pm Enjoy a performance of Bach's St Matthew Passion featuring the Akademie für Alte Musik Berlin and RIAS Kammerchor. Following the concert, load the coaches and return to the hotel.



DAY FOUR: Thursday, April 9, 2020 – AMSTERDAM (B) – Performance

Morning Breakfast as a group at the hotel.
 After breakfast, load the coaches (with instruments and performance attire) and depart for a visit to the Van Gogh Museum OR the Rijksmuseum.

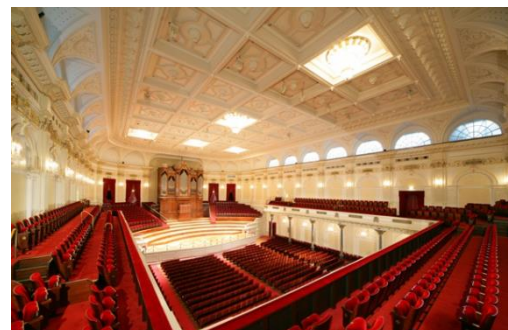
Vincent van Gogh was born in 1853 in Groot-Zundert in the south of Holland and during his short life he produced over 800 paintings. More than 200 of his portraits, landscapes, and still-lives, plus more than 500 drawings, are held in the collections here, forming the biggest cache of Van Gogh in the world.

One of the world's premier art museums, the Rijksmuseum features collections that demonstrate the rich artistic heritage of the Netherlands from 1200 to today. It is especially known for its unparalleled collection of paintings from the Dutch Golden Age from masters such as Rembrandt, Vermeer, and Rubens.

Afternoon Lunch on your own in Amsterdam.
 Transfer to location TBD – group **rehearsal** at location TBD.
 After rehearsal, transfer to the Concertgebouw.

Evening Dinner on your own nearby the venue.
 After dinner, return to the Concertgebouw and change into performance attire.
 Sound check on stage at the Concertgebouw.
PERFORMANCE in conjunction with a local ensemble at the Concertgebouw.

This majestic concert venue first opened its doors in 1888 and is still touted as one of the most acoustically perfect concert halls in the world. It is home to the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra and many world-class orchestras and soloists line up for the chance of appearing in the hallowed Grote Zaal (Great Hall) of the Concertgebouw thanks to its perfect sound quality.



Following the concert, enjoy time to meet/greet the local ensemble then board the coaches and return to hotel.

DAY FIVE: Friday, April 10, 2020 – AMSTERDAM (B)

Morning Breakfast as a group at the hotel.
Following breakfast, depart for a visit of Keukenhof – one of the world’s largest flower gardens.

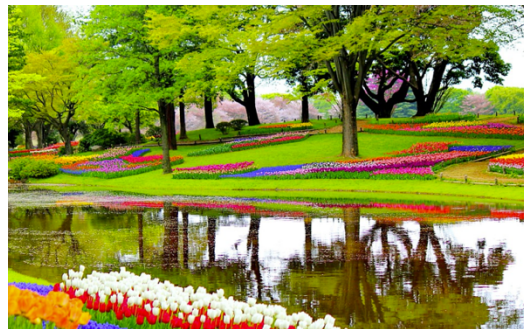
Situated in Lisse, approximately 7 million flower bulbs are planted annually in the park, which covers an area of 32 hectares (79 acres).

Afternoon Lunch on your own in the area.
After lunch, transfer to Zaanse Schans.

Zaanse Schans is an open-air museum located on a delightful old hamlet on the banks of the river Zaan with characteristic green wooden houses, charming gardens, tradesmen’s workshops, historic windmills, and much more.

Later this afternoon, transfer to Edam and enjoy a visit to the Jacobshoeve farm where you’ll be able to learn about cheese making and sample the products!

Evening Transfer back to Amsterdam for dinner on your own then return to the hotel.



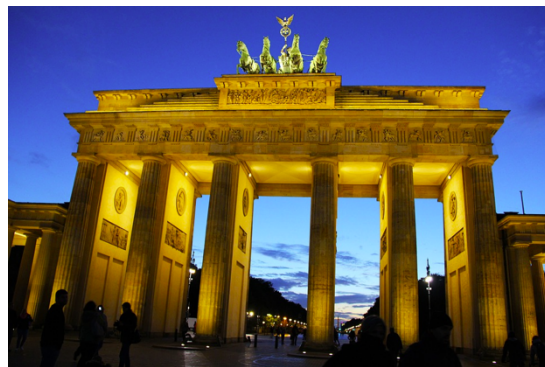
DAY SIX: Saturday, April 11, 2020 – AMSTERDAM → HAMM → BERLIN (B,D)

Morning Breakfast as a group at the hotel.
~7.00am Check-out of the hotel, load the coaches and instrument truck, and depart for Hamm – Santa Monica’s Sister City.

An important transportation hub in the Ruhr Region, Hamm was founded in 1226 along the Lippe River. Hamm was hit hard in the Black Death Plague of 1350 and then again during the 30-Years’ War in the early 17th century. During the 19th and 20th centuries, Hamm became an important center for the coal industry. Today, Hamm is still a center of Germany’s energy industry and an important center of law as the location of Germany’s Appeal’s Court. Santa Monica and Hamm have been Sister Cities since 1969.

11.00am Arrive into Hamm – possible Sister City activity (TBC) and lunch on your own.
1.00pm Load the coaches and depart for Berlin.

In the 30 years since the Wall came tumbling down, Berlin has re-established itself as Germany’s capital and gone through an urban and social transformation that has made it, once again, one of the most exciting cities in Europe. Superlative museums, grand (and grandiose) monuments, a performing arts scene that has no equal in Germany, fascinating neighborhoods to explore, fabulous parks and green spaces to enjoy, cafes, shopping, elegant restaurants and on-the-go street food—Berlin truly does have something for everyone.



Evening Upon arrival into Berlin, enjoy dinner as a group at a local restaurant.

DAY SEVEN: Sunday, April 12, 2020 (Easter) – BERLIN (B,D)

Morning

Breakfast as a group at the hotel.

After breakfast, possibly attend Easter Mass at a prominent church such as the Berliner Dom or the American Church Berlin.

Later this morning, visit the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe.

Berlin's Holocaust Memorial, located in Mitte on a stretch of the former "death strip" where the Wall once stood near Brandenburg Gate, is Berlin's stunning monument to the Holocaust, dedicated to the Jewish victims of the Nazi genocide of World War II. Impressive in its awesome grey soberness, rather than somberness, it includes an underground Ort der Information (Information Centre) located on the south- eastern side of the memorial grounds.



Afternoon

Lunch on your own in Berlin.

After lunch, meet your local guides and enjoy a guided sightseeing tour of Berlin – sights to include such highlights as the Brandenburg Gate, Berlin Cathedral, the Reichstag, the Fernsehturm (TV Tower), and much more.

Conclude your tour with a visit to Checkpoint Charlie, the name given by the Western Allies to the best-known Berlin Wall crossing point between East Berlin and West Berlin during the Cold War.

Evening

Enjoy an Easter Dinner as a group at a local restaurant, then return to the hotel.

DAY EIGHT: Monday, April 13, 2020 – BERLIN (B) – Workshop & Performance

- Morning** Breakfast as a group at the hotel.
Following breakfast, load the coaches and transfer to a local venue – possibly the Universität der Künste (UdK) Berlin (TBC).
Enjoy a **workshop** with a member of the music faculty at the Universität der Künste (UdK) Berlin (TBC – subject to availability).
- Afternoon** Lunch on your own in Berlin.
Transfer to the Berliner Philharmonie – group **rehearsal** at the Berliner Philharmonie (TBC – rehearsal is subject to availability of the hall).
- Evening** Dinner on your own nearby the venue.
After dinner, return to the Philharmonie and change into performance attire.
PERFORMANCE in conjunction with a local ensemble at the Berliner Philharmonie.

Home of the celebrated Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra, the Berliner Philharmonie is one of the first and still among the finest modern concert halls ever constructed. Inaugurated in 1963 with a performance of Beethoven's 9th Symphony under the direction of Herbert van Karajan, the Philharmonie was designed in a "vineyard" surround-tiered style by the renowned architect, Hans Scharoun so that every one of the 2,440 seats feel close to the stage. Today, this remarkable hall with its stunning acoustics and architecture is a "cathedral" to classical music and every major orchestra and artist's dream to perform in.

Following the concert, enjoy a post-concert reception including snacks with members of the local ensemble. Afterwards, pack up and return to the hotel.



DAY NINE: Tuesday, April 14, 2020 – BERLIN (B,D)

Morning	<p>Breakfast as a group at the hotel.</p> <p>This morning, enjoy further sightseeing in Berlin including a visit the Musikinstrumenten-Museum which houses a collection of over 3,200 instruments dating back to the 16th century and a visit to the Reichstag Building Dome which offers stunning views of Berlin from above.</p>	
Afternoon	<p>Lunch on own in Berlin.</p> <p>The afternoon is free to explore Berlin in approved chaperone groups – possibilities could include (all costs on own):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore one of Berlin's world-class museums such as the Pergamon Museum, the Neues Museum, or the Gemäldegalerie • Wander the everchanging East Berlin neighborhood of Unter den Linden • Enjoy a paddleboat ride along the Spree River • Explore the shops and restaurants in the Ku'Damm and/or along Friedrichstraße 	
Evening	<p>Enjoy a farewell dinner as a group then return to the hotel.</p>
