Throughout his career, Captain Flowers has served the department in numerous roles, including patrol officer, detective, patrol sergeant, detective sergeant, patrol lieutenant and most recently, as Bureau Commander (Captain) of the Investigations Services Bureau. He has also held a wide range of specialized assignments, including STAT team member, STAT team leader and STAT team commander.

In addition, Captain Flowers has served as the department's Public Information Officer, Social Media Manager, Property and Evidence Custodian, K-9 Supervisor, Field Training Officer, FTO Program Supervisor and instructor in multiple subject areas. He currently serves as the Deputy Records Custodian and Facilities Manager.

In his new role, Captain Flowers' responsibilities will include:

- Maintain direct supervision of captains of the Community Services, Operations and Investigative Services Bureaus.
- Prepare and oversee the budget for the police department.
- Supervise the media function for the police department in conjunction with the City's Communications Manager.
- Act as liaison with federal, state, and other agencies on behalf of the Chief of Police and the department.
- Respond to major crime scenes as needed and assist in disaster planning initiatives.

Captain Flowers graduated from Blue Springs High School in 2005 and earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Missouri in 2009. He began his career with the Blue Springs Police Department in 2010. He graduated from the Missouri Police Chiefs' Command College in 2021.

"I'm honored and excited to continue my career serving the community I grew up in," said Captain Flowers. "I look forward to having a greater role in advancing the Blue Springs Police Department in a positive direction, supporting and working alongside the

exceptional men and women who make up this department and ensuring that every action we take strengthens the trust, safety and well-being of the community we serve.”
