

Making: Bags are handmade by the Ladies of Alpha Ministry.

Sending: The filled bags are sent to S.O.A.R. Ministries in Loganville, GA for storage until November.

Taking: Bags are loaded in vans and driven to the Mexican border and taken into central Mexico to Bethshean Mexico Mission.

Hearing and Receiving the Word: Children and their parents in nearby villages hear the Christmas story of Jesus and His love.

Gifts: Each child is given a bag of gifts from you. Sometimes it is the first gift they have ever received.


Sacrificial Giving Blesses Us

Why Your Devotional Time Matters— and How to Make It Happen



Life pulls us in every direction. But there's one daily habit that centers us, anchors us, and brings us into God's presence: devotional time. Jesus Himself withdrew often to be with the Father. If He needed it, how much more do we?

So how do you start? Keep it simple:

- Pick a time (mornings work well) and place (quiet helps).
- Read Scripture—even a short passage.
- **Reflect**: What is God saying to me?
- **Pray**: Talk with God. Listen.
- Write: A sentence or two about what stood out.

Start small. Even 10 minutes a day can change your heart over time. Your soul needs this daily bread. God is waiting—not to scold, but to speak.


Sunday Mornings
