At 12 noon on Tuesday, I was honored to host a dedication ceremony at our Municipal Marina in memory of Sea Isle's longtime Marina Supervisor and past Fire Chief, Frank Edwardi, Sr. It was wonderful to see such a large crowd of people at the ceremony, including Frank's wife, Kathy, and other members of the Edwardi family. Also present were representatives from our Volunteer Fire Department and many others who admired Chief Edwardi, including Mike and Jeannie Monichetti, who arranged for a banner plane to fly by, which read "We Love You Cheech!" During the ceremony, we unveiled a new sign to make everyone aware that our marina is now known as the "Frank P. Edwardi, Sr. Sea Isle City Marina" – a fitting tribute to a man who served our community for many years.
