

## **PROJECT UPDATES**

August 3, 2017

In accordance with our typical practice during the summer season, we try to limit the amount of construction taking place on public property in order to minimize the disruption to our residents and visitors, as for many, this time of the year is precious. We also are in the process of preparing and putting into place plans for the next round of capital improvements throughout the City. As these projects move forward through the design, bidding, and construction phases, we will continue to provide you with updates on their progress.

### Fall Utility Reconstruction - various streets

On May 10, 2017, City Council awarded a contract to Perna Finnegan, Inc., of Vineland, New Jersey, in the amount of \$1,247,027.25 for utility reconstruction at the following locations:

72<sup>nd</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue 81<sup>st</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue 62<sup>nd</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue 53<sup>rd</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade 54<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade 55<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade 57<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade 48<sup>th</sup> Street from Central Avenue to Park Road 52<sup>nd</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to the Promenade

Work will begin on this project in the fall of 2017.

# Fall Utility Reconstruction - 39th Street

On June 27, 2017, City Council awarded a contract to Perna Finnegan, Inc., of Vineland, New Jersey, in the amount of \$287,782.31 for utility reconstruction on 39<sup>th</sup> Street from Central Avenue to Kneass Street. Work on this project will begin in the fall of 2017.

#### Road Reconstruction - various streets

On March 28, 2017, City Council awarded a contract to Arawak Paving Co., Inc. of Hammonton, New Jersey, in the amount of \$443,700 for reconstruction of the asphalt roadway at the following locations:

47<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade

49<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Promenade

65<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Central Avenue

69<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue

76<sup>th</sup> Street from Landis Avenue to Pleasure Avenue

77<sup>th</sup> Street from Roberts Avenue to Central Avenue

The contract documents require that no work be performed on this project between June 10 and September 17, 2017, unless authorized by the City. Concrete and paving has been completed on 47<sup>th</sup> Street, 49<sup>th</sup> Street, 65<sup>th</sup> Street and 69<sup>th</sup> Street. Those streets have entered the punch list phase. Work on 76<sup>th</sup> Street and 77<sup>th</sup> Street will resume in the fall.

#### Sea Isle Boulevard

The Cape May County Board of Chosen Freeholders, at their May 13, 2014 meeting, awarded a \$12.7 million contract to South State, Inc. for the Sea Isle Boulevard Improvement project that will raise the roadway by approximately 4.5 feet and otherwise reconstruct Sea Isle Boulevard. Traffic has been diverted to the south side of the boulevard; and the contractor placed fill on the north side of the causeway to an average height of about 6.5 feet, which was 2 feet higher than the eventual height of the completed roadway. The additional 2 feet, which was removed in preparation for paving, was surcharge to compress the underlying layers of soil. The goal was to obtain as much settlement as possible prior to paving on top of the new fill. The majority of the north side of the causeway has been paved, but will not be utilized until the fall of this year, as additional construction must be done prior to the switch-over. As promised by the County, a rumble strip was added to the center of the current driving lanes, as an additional safety

After switch-over of traffic to the north side this fall, traffic will remain on the north side of the causeway until completion of the roadwork. The current schedule is to complete the roadwork for the new causeway prior to the 2019 summer season.

Motorists are advised to be aware of the revised traffic patterns in the construction zone and the reduced speed limit.

#### **Utility Reconstruction**

On October 11, 2016, City Council awarded a contract to F.W. Shawl & Sons Construction in the amount of \$1,003,025 for utility work to various streets as listed below:

79<sup>th</sup> Street – Central to Roberts Landis Avenue – 73<sup>rd</sup> to 72<sup>nd</sup> Landis Avenue – 74<sup>th</sup> to 76<sup>th</sup> 78<sup>th</sup> Street - Landis to Central 78<sup>th</sup> Street – Central to Roberts 81<sup>st</sup> Street – Central to Bay End 66<sup>th</sup> Street – Landis to Central 68<sup>th</sup> Street – Landis to Central 71<sup>st</sup> Street – Landis to Central 73<sup>rd</sup> Street – Landis to Central 76<sup>th</sup> Street – Landis to Central

This project is on hold until the fall.

## **Demolition of West Jersey Fire House**

Demolition has been completed at the old firehouse on West Jersey Avenue, and site restoration has commenced. Asphalt has been placed for the court surfacing, curb and sidewalk has been installed as well as perimeter fencing. The fencing has been installed to designate the two courts for pickle ball. Posts, nets and park benches have been ordered. Plans have been initiated for court lines to be installed. It is anticipated that the facility will be completed for play prior to Labor Day weekend.

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
