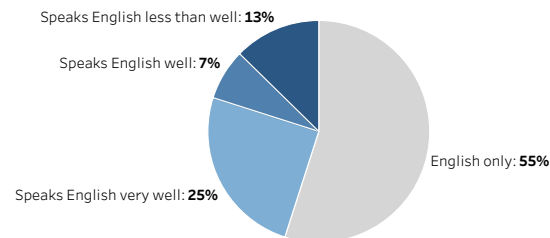

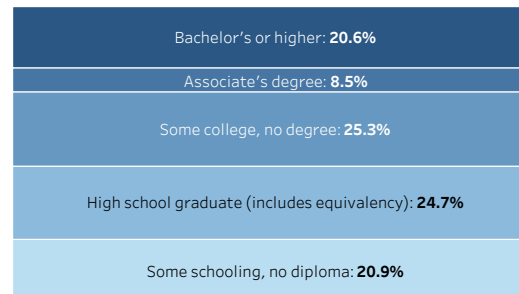

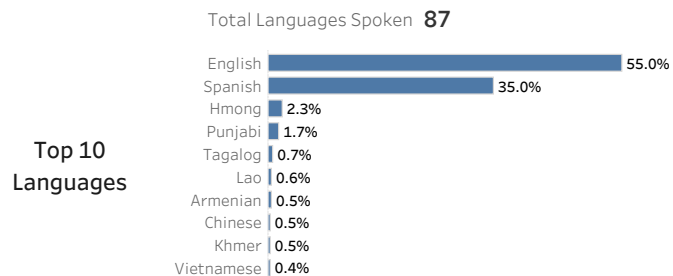

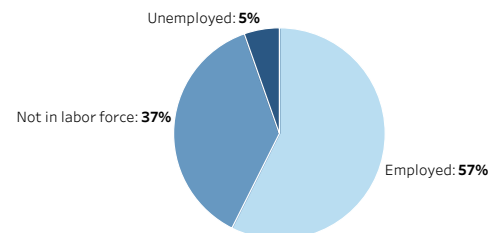
LANGUAGES SPOKEN AT HOME

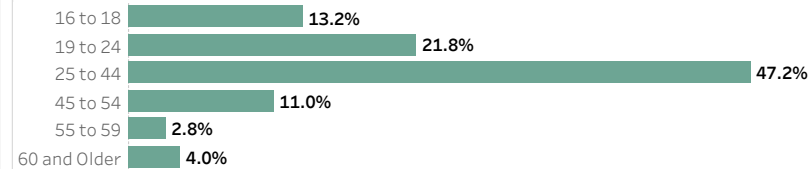

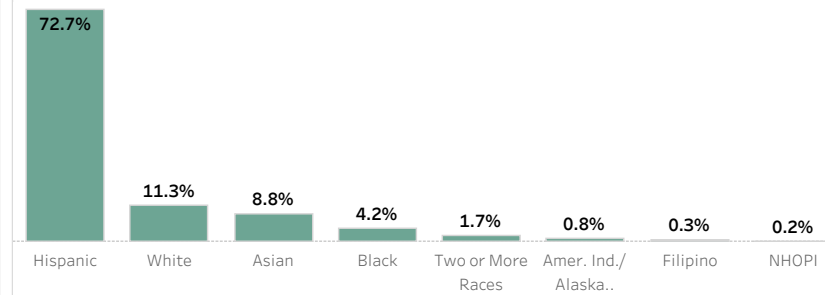
