We continue to promote the Region using our TC branded materials, and our Relocation and Business Guides are regularly requested from people looking for information about lifestyle in our region.



BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

The TCPEP believes in the value of one-on-one business support services. People needing help starting or expanding a business can meet with our Business Development Officers one-on-one to discuss business strategy, business planning and other opportunities and challenges.

Over this past year, Jason Steele has worked with over 150 businesses. In October, Jason moved on to a new positon with Asante Logistic, but remains with the TCPEP part-time helping businesses in the region. In November, the TCPEP welcomed J. David Phillips to the team. David is already busy working with several new start-ups and businesses with international market opportunities.

BDO IMPACT

When we support businesses, we track key performance indicators to measure impact on the local economy. As of Dec 31, 2020:

We helped **150 businesses** with resource navigation.

We helped 51 businesses access funding support valued over \$4,810,000.

We helped 22 businesses generate incremental revenue **valued over \$3,152,000**.

We helped 17 businesses work on process improvements.

We helped 13 businesses expand their workforce – This resulted in 14 Hires / New Jobs in the region.

Additionally, 14 businesses worked on cost reductions and 17 were assisted with improving profitability.

...and we're just getting started.

Business Accelerator Program

Launched last fall, this program provides greater assistance to companies who have exponential growth opportunities. Over a 12-month period, businesses work closely with our Development Officers to develop and implement growth strategies to accelerate business growth.

Free Online Strategy Support

The Partnership and Symplicity Designs launched an online platform for business owners, providing them with management tools and practices in a convenient, on-demand format. Content covers guiding business principles and business strategy tools to support growth opportunities. **Thirteen businesses** have accessed the sessions and we are anticpating greater uptake this winter.



COVID-19 SUPPORT

Through COVID-19, our Business Development Officer helped over 100 businesses with cashflow forecasting and navigation of various business and support services. We are presently surveying supported businesses to get feedback on what government programs were most utilized.

Jason went above and beyond in ensuring that local businesses are aware of resources available to help navigate keeping a small business open during these challenging times.

COVID-19 DELIVERY SERVICE

More consumers are buying online and local businesses are following suit by adopting eCommerce platforms. In rural Nova Scotia, affordable, timely transportation of goods to consumers is an important gap that needs to be addressed as markets shift online.

During the Christmas retail season, we collaborated with the Town of Truro, the Downtown Truro Partnership, and Colchester County to continue to test Colchester Delivery Service, which helped local SMEs provide over **630 orders (\$45,000 worth of product)** to customers in Colchester, Pictou, East Hants, and HRM.

Helping Tourism Operators

In June 2020, an Accelerated Market Readiness (AMR) Program was launched in Colchester and Cumberland counties. With support from the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency, the TCPEP and the Cumberland Business Connector facilitated AMR consultations with 22 tourism and tourism-related operators in the fall of 2020. The project was designed to provide one-on-one tourism planning and advice to tourism operators and identify broader tourism training and supports to help the sector bounce back from COVID-19.



Tourism operators focused their AMR experience on increasing sales, profitability, and revenue generation. And many worked on branding and defining their unique selling position.

FOLLOW UP WITH OPERATORS

TCPEP Business Development Officers are following up with operators to provide **strategy guidance & business planning support.**

DIGITAL FOOTPRINT

The TCPEP is conducting a Digital Footprint that generates a real-time snapshot of the region's online presence. Digital Footprint is an objective and credible picture of what operators need to do to enhance their regional and business profile online.

REGIONAL FORUM

We are exploring hosting a Tourism Forum (for operators) to deliver relevant and up-to-date information, including; Expectations for Nova Scotia Tourism 2021; New 2021 tourism products and offers; strategies; and maximizing the Cliffs of Fundy Geopark.

People Attraction & Retention

Connecting Youth to Business

The TCPEP **Connector Program** helps local and international graduates, skilled professionals and new residents expand their professional networks in Truro Colchester. The program just launched the Connector App (Google Play and Apple) to enhance hybrid delivery and increase connections across Nova Scotia.



Matthew Berrigan, our program manager, is a resource for businesses who want to connect with up-and-coming talent from our post-secondary institutions. Matthew supported the NSCC TechConnect virtual conference and he is working with partners to create networking opportunities for young professionals in the region. Truro Colchester has immediate need for 11 physicians & 8,400 people in need of a family physician. The TCPEP continues to support the local Physician Recruitment Committee and Nova Scotia Health recruiters.

This past summer, we supported orientation day for the new and returning **Dalhousie Medical Residents.** The TCPEP provided the Resident Physicians with lunch and toured them around the community, visiting local hot spots like Raging Crow Distillery, Victoria Park, Downtown Truro, etc. They also visited with local Mayors, and the day ended with supper at the Nook & Cranny Pub.

The TCPEP developed a series of four Physician testimonial videos. Videos have been helpful to recruiters and local physicians who promote Truro and Colchester to potential doctors and residents in Canada and abroad.



Physician videos of Dr. Beau Blois, Dr. Kris Srivatsa and Dr. Tanya Munroe received over 44,000 impressions, 1,300 reactions, and 200 comments on social media.

The Dalhousie Faculty of Medicine Resident Retreat was held virtually in September. TCPEP staff and Dr. Blaauwendraat attended the virtual job fair and connected with eight residents who expressed interest in the Truro Colchester region. Lindsey followed up with the online participants; she had subsequent phone calls and a lunch meeting with two residents.

12 physicians were recruited over the past 12 months.
