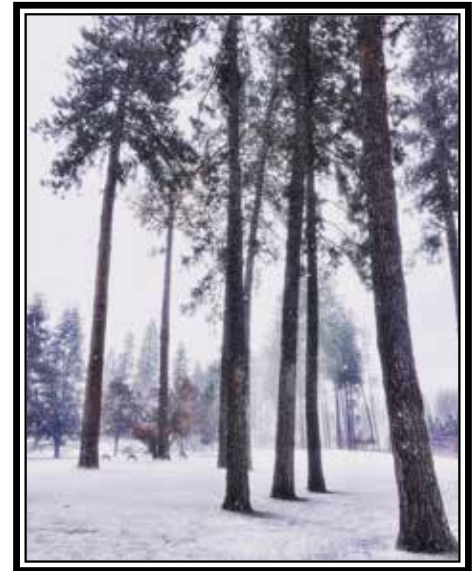

tions. Our contracted architects are David Kahn and Tim Jackson who submitted drawings that were approved by the membership in 2012. At the time of each hole construction, the architect is on site and supervises hole layout. Often he will see features that he feels are better managed in a fashion different than in the original conceptual drawings. If this is the case, he submits recommendations to the Golf Course Master Planning Committee for final approval. This "architectural license" allows hole reconstruction to be a dynamic process to optimize the final product.

Golf Course Maintenance Musings

I was recently asked to write a newsletter article that encapsulated the 2018 golf season and also provide a peek into what the membership might expect for the 2019 golf season. With things moving at breakneck speed around here over the past few years (including this one) I must go back over my notes to remember all that's been accomplished over the past year...

This season was very intense for our crew. We were blessed with incredible turf quality coming out of winter this year and it was a good thing because the spring project/tournament line up had no room for turf recovery! We hit the ground running with course cleanup/agronomic practices, Red House landscaping and new cart path prep/construction...

However, considering all of the projects, I would say that this has been our best season yet! The new equipment we received this spring was pivotal in allowing us to provide you with the most consistent and quality course conditioning... Our green speeds remained very consistent throughout the golf season, our fairways retained impressive density/uniformity and thanks to the relief provided by our new native grass areas, our rough mowers were able to mow all 'in-play' course roughs three times per week!

Agronomically, I couldn't be more pleased with this property! Always a slow evolution, developing a stable and buffered soil chemistry and

oxygen filled structure takes significant time and continued effort! Building a plant support system that allows it to store energy, drain and hold the nutrients necessary to withstand all that Mother Nature can throw at it is our ongoing objective...

As we now button up the #7 construction project and head toward winter, we are feverishly cleaning the course and preparing the turf for the coming elements. Once the snow cover comes to stay, our winter watch begins. Arguably the most critical part of the year, keeping a close eye on extreme temperature fluctuations, days of snow cover, melt offs and ice accumulation are critical observations and most importantly, how we react to those conditions can make or break our chances for coming out clean in the spring.

For the 2019 season I would say... Expect continuing course improvement! We have built tremendous positive momentum over the past years and that momentum will continue into the foreseeable future... I have every confidence that our turf will continue to improve in quality, consistency and resiliency. Our new equipment and ever improving processes are yielding ongoing quality and efficiency for course operations and our full time and annually returning staff members ensure that those positive attributes remain constant.



In closing, I will list just a few of the specific projects we have lined up for the 2019 Season:

1. More implementation of the Perimeter Landscape Plan; focused on reducing road noise/exposure and improving landscape continuity throughout the course.
2. Installation of new bunker sand in hole #'s 4, 7 and 18 green side.
3. New Cart Paths! We will be installing all the new path on hole's #7 & 8 in the spring and as many other areas as the budget will allow.
4. Construction of hole #15! Although a final decision has not yet been made, we are hoping that funds will allow us to continue the Long Range Plan momentum by renovating the 15th hole next fall!

While there will undoubtedly be many more projects than what I've listed above, these are a few of the highlights we are looking forward to in the coming year! On behalf of myself and your maintenance staff, we would like to wish everyone a happy and safe holiday season! See you next spring (if not before)!
