Community & School

The town of Billerica is located 20 miles northwest of Boston. Incorporated in 1655, the town remained predominantly agricultural until the mid-nineteenth century when a major mill complex was build on the Concord River in North Billerica. Although a number of small industries grew over the next 100 years, it was not until the 1950's that the present day industrial base was established. Today, Billerica is a major regional employer and home to several technology firms. It has grown rapidly from 10,000 residents in 1950 to 40,000 residents today.

Billerica Memorial High School is a comprehensive high school for grades 9-12, with a current enrollment of 1,153 students. The school operates on a modified block schedule with primary courses and electives meeting 3 out of 5 days per week. The Program of Studies features a broad range of courses essential for the lifelong learning needs of all students. The high school currently offers 19 Advanced Placement courses, a perennial national award winning DECA Team, and several Project Lead The Way courses. Billerica Memorial High School offers 27 sports, 61 teams, and an extensive variety of fine arts programs in the areas of vocal, instrumental drama, and visual arts. Challenging Academic Opportunities

Project Lead The Way

Project Lead The Way courses provide a comprehensive approach to STEM education. Through activities, projects, and problem-based curriculum, PLTW gives students the opportunity to apply their skills, identify problems, find unique and creative solutions, and self-initiate their own learning. BMHS offers five PLTW courses: Intro to Engineering Design, Principles of Engineering, Principles of Biomedical Science, Computer Science Principles, and Human Body Systems.

American Experience

American Experience courses are open to students in grades 10 and 11, and are interdisciplinary courses that combine both English Literature and History. This cotaught program requires students to have a high level of motivation, interest, and curiosity, and involves extensive reading, writing, and critical thinking. These courses are designed to be a part of a two-year cohort, with students taking both American Experience I and American Experience II. The courses satisfy both the English and the US History requirement for graduation.

Advanced Placement Courses

In 2018, students engaged in 19 different types of Advanced Placement tests. Billerica Memorial High School's Advanced Placement passing rate (3 or better) is 60.4%. Advanced Placement classes held at BMHS include: Calculus (AB/BC in 2018, AB only in 2019), Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, European History (2018), Physics (1/2/C), Psychology, Spanish, French and Italian Language, Statistics, and United States History. In 2018, 222 students took 446 exams.

Grading & Performance

Competencies

All graduates have passed the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) in the areas of English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science. Graduation requirements are aligned with MASSCORE requirements, which includes a minimum of four years of English, four years of Math, three years of a lab-based Science, three years of history, two years of the same foreign language, one year of an arts program and five additional "core" courses such as business education, health, and/or technology.

Grade Point Average & Rank




