Final Utah Response Rates

The State of Utah's final 2020 Census Self-Response Rate (SRR) was 71.0%, ranked 10th highest in the United States. This was also 2.4 percentage points higher than Utah's SRR of 68.6% in 2010. 64.4% of self-responding Utahns utilized the Census Bureau's online option.

99.9% of Utah Households Have Been Counted

This enumeration rate is a combination of Self-Response (71.0%) and those who were counted during the Census Bureau's Non-Response Follow-Up operation (28.9%).

A Community Effort

Utah's 2020 Census self-response rate was the product of counties, municipalities, libraries, and other local organizations working together to ensure that all Utahns were counted and represented. These organizations worked together to make sure Utah residents understood what the Census means for the state and their communities.

1. Davis County – 81.2%, 76.2% Internet Response
2. Morgan County – 80.7%, 76.2% Internet Response
3. Cache County – 77.4%, 71.3% Internet Response
4. Utah County – 76.1%, 71.6% Internet Response
5. Salt Lake County – 74.3%, 68.0% Internet Response
6. Box Elder County – 73.8%, 65.1% Internet Response
7. Weber County – 72.5%, 65.0% Internet Response
8. Tooele County – 71.6%, 65.4% Internet Response
9. Juab County – 67.1%, 55.6% Internet Response
10. Washington County – 66.2%, 58.6% Internet Response
