

# Immunization Requirements for the 2022-2023 School Year

**Waivers for exemption from immunizations are not accepted in Catholic Schools.**

Requirements for all students:

- The Immunization Certificate must be signed by a licensed physician or a public health official.
- Certificate must have a printed name and address of the physician, health department, or Georgia Registry of Immunization Transactions and Services (GRITS) official issuing the certificate.
- Certificate must have a complete date of issue with the month, day, and year.

Please see the attached document for specific required vaccines for students entering Kindergarten and Seventh Grade. To be sure that your child's Immunization Certificate is valid, please note the box in the upper right corner. There will be an "X" in the box beside their grade level if the certificate is complete (see diagram below). **Blessed Sacrament School is not permitted to allow any child entrance into class without a valid Immunization Certificate on file.**

If your child has a medical exemption, your doctor should update the medical exemption column (column on the far right) annually. If this is not updated, the certificate could be invalid.
