### [Walking Tours](#)

If you are interested in a walking tour with a tour guide, or something self-guided, there are many options to choose from, including a brewery tour, skyway tour, gangster tour, the [St. Paul Scavenger tour](#) or the very popular “Twin Cities Ghost Tour”. ### [Murals in Minneapolis Art Walk: Monstrous Murals & Rock n' Roll Relics](#)

The Minneapolis Art Walk is chock-full of impressive pieces, from sculptural masterpieces within the Walker Sculpture Garden to full-wall murals on downtown buildings. Uplifting colorful and cultural works are sprinkled between iconic exhibits. Minnesota also claims to be ‘home’ to Bob Dylan and Prince, so be prepared for a healthy dose of musical memorabilia! The murals in Minneapolis await, so slip into some comfortable shoes, gather a crew, and get your tickets.

### [Minnehaha Falls](#)

This urban park is a popular sight for locals and visitors thanks to the beautiful waterfall that flows from Minneapolis' chain of lakes into the Mississippi River.

Located along the river, a short drive away from downtown, the Minnesota Marine Art Museum is a specialized art gallery dedicated to the most important element on the planet, water, and its relationship with man. Explore the unique selection of different styles of art with a singular theme.

Set on the edge of the Mississippi River, the museum has an exquisite permanent collection along with rotating exhibits by guest artists.

#### [Mill City Museum](#)

This museum was creatively built out of the ruins of the Washburn "A" Mill. Inside you can learn all about flour and how the flour mills used water power in innovative ways the world had never seen.
