Denzel Washington.

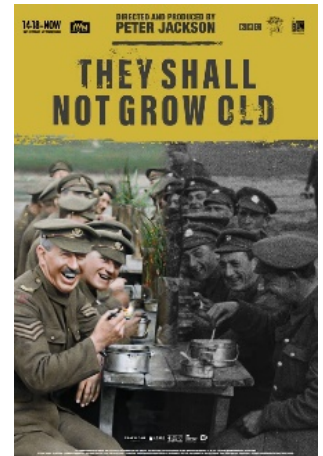
Sunday September 22, 1 pm. Judaism
